Structure of agricultural holdings

Luxembourg 2003

A farm structure survey was carried out in all EU Member States in 2003 (2002 in Poland). The detailed results are now available for 10 Member States: Belgium, Denmark, Ireland, Latvia, Luxembourg, Hungary, Malta, Finland, Sweden and the United Kingdom. Results for the other Member States will become available in the course of the next six months. This Statistics in Focus is part of a series of country-specific publications, all following the same structure.

In Luxembourg, in May, 2003 almost 2 300 agricultural holdings had an economic size of at least one ESU (European size unit)*, which means 12% decline compared to 2000.


- These holdings employed 3 900 AWUs (annual work unit), the equivalent of 3 900 persons working full time;
- they made use of 127.5 thousand ha of agricultural area, which is on average 55.4 hectare per holding (compared to 48.2 ha in 2000).

Amongst these 2 300 agricultural holdings,

- 11% made use of less than one AWU, while 74% made use of 2 or more AWUs;
- 16% used less than 5 ha, while 15% used more than 100 ha;
- 16% were mixed holdings, while 84% were specialised: dairies 32%, producers on vineyards 16%, cattle fattening and rearing 11%, other grazing livestock 14%, field cropping 8%, others 4%;
- about 2% practised organic farming.




- 19% were women:
- 35% were aged 55 or more 50% or more in holdings between 1 and 16 ESU;
- 9% had another gainful activity as major occupation.



>METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

The survey on the structure of agricultural holdings in Luxembourg was carried out in May 2003 on an exhaustive base. Prior full-scale agricultural census was conducted on an annual basis since 1953. The reference time of the FSS 2003 was 15 May 2003, however for farm labour force characteristics the preceding 12 months.

The FSS relates to agricultural holdings whose utilised agricultural area is one hectare or more and those whose area is less than one hectare if they produce a certain proportion for sale or if their production unit exceeds certain physical thresholds. The target population was all the farms with an operating base located in the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg. The list of holdings was updated and completed at municipality level prior to the census.

The data are multi-level checked; the non-response was only 0.5%.

For each activity ('enterprise') on a farm (for instance wheat, dairy cow or vineyard), a **standard gross margin (SGM)** is estimated, based on the area (or the number of heads) and a regional coefficient. The sum of such margins in a farm is its **economic size**, expressed in **European Size Units (ESU)**. 1 ESU is equal to 1200 euros.

Due to the differences in the coverage of units of less than 1 ESU across Member States, these data are not comparable between countries. That is why the present analysis and graphs focus on the holdings of at least one ESU.

Each farm is classified in the community typology by its economic size and its **type of farming**, depending on the share of each enterprise in its economic size. For instance, a farm where breeding sows account for more than 2/3 of the economic size is classified as *specialist pig rearing* (type 5011). Depending on the level of aggregation, farms are grouped into 8 to 70 types.

Annual working unit (AWU) means the labour force working yearly like a worker employed on full time basis. In Luxembourg, it is defined as 2200 working hours per year (275 eight-hour working days), provided the person is between 15 and 80 years.
