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Farm structure in Slovenia - 2005

75% of agricultural land and 76% of livestock in farms of less than 20 ha

This Statistics in Focus is the second issue of a series of country-specific publications on the results of the Farm Structure Survey (FSS) 2005. It provides a brief but nevertheless comprehensive insight into the farm structure in Slovenia. A similar publication was issued in February 2005 presenting the results of the FSS 2003 in Slovenia.

In June 2005 in Slovenia, about **61 thousand* agricultural holdings** had an economic size of at least 1 European Size Unit (ESU).


- These holdings employed 83 thousand AWUs (annual work units), the equivalent of 83 thousand persons working full time;
- they made use of about 448 thousand ha of agricultural area, which is on average **7.4 ha per holding** (compared to 7.3 ha in 2003).

Among these 61 thousand agricultural holdings

- 36% made use of less than one AWU, while 20% made use of 2 or more AWUs;
- 51% used less than 5 ha agricultural area, while 4% used 20 ha or more;
- 18% were holdings of the type mixed cropping, 16% specialist dairy farming, 16% mixed livestock mainly grazing, 8% were producing various crops and livestock combined, and 8% were specialised in cattle rearing and fattening;
- 71% of their agricultural area was situated in less favoured or mountain areas;
- 2% were organic farms;
- 61% were producing mainly for their own consumption;
- 6% benefited from direct investment aid.

Among the 61 thousand sole holders

- 25% were women;
- 55% were aged 55 or more, and only 5% younger than 35 years;
- 71% had another gainful activity as their major occupation.



* Due to differences in the thresholds across Member States, this figure is not comparable between countries. This is why the present analysis, including Tables 1-4 and the graphs focus on the holdings of at least one ESU. See methodological notes for more information on the concept of the ESU.

Slovenia 2005 – Holdings of at least 1 ESU



▷METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

In Slovenia, the survey on the structure of agricultural holdings was carried out in June 2005 using the sample survey method. The previous full-scale agricultural census was conducted in 2000. The reference date for the FSS 2005 is 1 June 2005, while for the labour force characteristics the reference period is between 1 June 2004 and 31 May 2005.

The FSS relates to agricultural holdings performing agricultural activity; the definition of the holding and the thresholds have not been changed since 2000. The target population was the family farms included in the Statistical Farm Register and all the business enterprises of the Business Register. The list of units is updated twice a year using information of the statistical surveys and of administrative data sources (Register of Territorial Units, IACS). All business enterprises have been surveyed. In case of family holdings the sampling method was the same of those one in 2003. The frame was stratified by 20 physical criteria (e.g. UAA, extensive orchard, cattle) and by statistical regions (NUTS 3 level). The stratification produced 4 groups, where the largest holdings were included in group 1, while the smallest in group 4. Altogether 48 strata have been established. In order to obtain reasonable and representative samples, from strata of the largest holdings all units have been selected (full scope), while in the others proportional allocation was applied according to the number of units in each strata. Systematic random sampling was used to choose the units to be surveyed. Finally 17000 family holdings have been selected for FSS 2005.

For each activity ('enterprise') on a farm (for instance wheat, dairy cow or vineyard), a **standard gross margin (SGM)** is estimated, based on the area (or the number of heads) and a regional coefficient. The sum of such margins in a farm is its **economic size**, expressed in **European Size Units (ESU)**. 1 ESU is equal to 1200 euros.

Each farm is classified in the community typology by its economic size and its **type of farming**, depending on the share of each enterprise in its economic size. For instance, a farm where breeding sows account for more than 2/3 of the economic size is classified as *specialist pig rearing* (type 5011). Depending on the level of aggregation, farms are grouped into 8 to 70 types.

Annual work unit (AWU) is equivalent to a worker employed on a full time basis for one year. In Slovenia it is 1800 hours (225 working days of 8 working hours per day).

Livestock Unit (LU) is equivalent to a dairy cow. The number of animals (number of heads) is converted into LU using a set of coefficients reflecting the feed requirements of the different animal categories.

Subsistence farming refers here to all farms below 1 ESU economic size. Note that the number of farms can't be compared between countries due to the differences in coverage of FSS.


