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# Structure of agricultural holdings France 2003

A farm structure survey was carried out in all EU Member States in 2003 (2002 in Poland). The detailed results are now available for 13 Member States: Belgium, Denmark, France, Ireland, Latvia, Luxembourg, Hungary, Malta, the Netherlands, Slovenia, Finland, Sweden and the United Kingdom. Results for the other Member States will become available in the course of the next months. This Statistics in Focus is part of a series of country-specific publications, all following the same structure.

In France\*, in 2003 about 566 300 agricultural holdings had an economic size of at least one ESU (European size unit)\*\* (10% decline in the number of the holdings on the motherland compared to 2000).


- These holdings employed 901 100 AWUs (annual work units), the equivalent of 901 100 persons working full time;
- they made use of 27.7 million ha of agricultural area, which is on average 48.9 hectare per holding (50.6 ha on the motherland compared to 45.8 ha in 2000).


Amongst these 566 300 agricultural holdings,

- 32% made use of less than one AWU, while 29% made use of 2 or more AWUs;
- 22% used less than 5 ha, while 15% used 100 ha or more;
- 19% were mixed holdings, while 81% were specialised: for cereals, oil seed and protein crops 17%, vineyards 14%, dairies 12%, cattle rearing and fattening 12%, other grazing livestock 11%, field cropping 7%, other permanent crops 4%, horticulture 3% (of which 35% under glass), pigs and poultry 2%;
- about 1.5% practised organic farming.

Amongst the 479 400 sole holders

- 22% were women;
- 35% were aged 55 or more, only 11% is younger than 35 years;
- 17% had another gainful activity as major occupation.









#### >METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

The 2003 survey on the structure of agricultural holdings in France was carried out between October 2003 and April 2004 on a sample base. Prior full-scale agricultural census was conducted in 2000. For the first time the 2003 results are including the overseas departments.

The target population was the holdings producing agricultural goods, reaching a certain threshold (in terms of land area, number of livestock or volume of production) and independently run. These holdings are drawn from an updated permanent Sample Survey Basis. The frame was stratified by type of farming and economic size. For each department (NUTS 3) an exhaustiveness threshold (generally 250ESU) was defined to ensure all units with biggest importance being included; these holdings were inserted into a separate stratum. Generally 20 strata (in Brittany 24) were defined, plus the special ones. In the strata random sampling with Neyman-allocation was applied based on SGM, but in some cases on utilised agricultural area. In each department (NUT 3) the number of holdings drawn varies between 300 and 1200 depending on the importance and diversity of agriculture. The sample size was 79 431 (of which 3 809 in the overseas departments).

The data are multi-level checked. The non-response was 0.59%, which was handled by "replacement" (interviewing a holding with similar characteristics). Where replacement was not possible questionnaires were filled in using information from the 2000 census and administrative data sources (CAP files). Missing or incorrect data were handled following telephone contact with the farmers.

For each activity ('enterprise') on a farm (for instance wheat, dairy cow or vineyard), a **standard gross margin (SGM)** is estimated, based on the area (or the number of heads) and a regional coefficient. The sum of such margins in a farm is its **economic size**, expressed in **European Size Units (ESU)**. 1 ESU is equal to 1200 euros.

Due to differences in the coverage of units of less than 1 ESU across Member States, these data are not comparable between countries. That is why the present analysis and graphs focus on the holdings of at least one ESU.

Each farm is classified in the community typology by its economic size and its **type of farming**, depending on the share of each enterprise in its economic size. For instance, a farm where breeding sows account for more than 2/3 of the economic size is classified as *specialist pig rearing* (type 5011). Depending on the level of aggregation, farms are grouped into 8 to 70 types.

**Annual working unit** (AWU) means the labour force working yearly like a worker employed on full time basis, it is 1824 hours (228 working days of 8 working hours per day).
