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# **Structure of agricultural holdings**

## **Italy 2003**

A farm structure survey was carried out in all EU Member States in 2003 (2002 in Poland). The detailed results are now available for Belgium, Denmark, France, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Luxembourg, Hungary, Malta, the Netherlands, Slovenia, Finland, Sweden and the United Kingdom. Results for the other Member States will become available in the course of the next months. This Statistics in Focus is part of a series of country-specific publications, all following the same structure.

In Italy, in December 2003 about 1 426 300 agricultural holdings had an economic size of at least 1 ESU (European Size Unit)\*, which means 6.5% decline compared to 2000.

- These holdings employed 1.32 million AWUs (annual work units), the equivalent of 1.32 million persons working full time;

- they made use of 12.7 million ha of agricultural area, which is on average 8.9 hectare per holding (compared to 8.2 ha in 2000).

Amongst these 1 426 300 agricultural holdings,

- 65% made use of less than one AWU, while 11% made use of 2 or more AWUs;


- 69% used less than 5 ha, while 1% used 100 ha or more;

- 14% were mixed holdings, while 86% were specialised: for olive productions 21%, cereals, oil seed and protein crops 16%, vineyards 11%, fruit and citrus fruit 9%, combined permanent crops 9%, field cropping 9%, dairies 3%, sheep, goat and various grazing livestock 3%, horticulture 2% (of which more than half under glass), cattle fattening and rearing 1%;


- about 2% practised organic farming.


Amongst the 1.41 million sole holders


- 28% were women;
- 63% were aged 55 or more, and only 5% younger than 35 years;
- 22% had another gainful activity as major occupation.

#### >METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

The survey on the structure of agricultural holdings in Italy was carried out between in December 2003 on a sample base. Prior to this survey full-scale agricultural census has been conducted last time in 2000. The reference period of FSS 2003 was from 1st November 2002 until 31<sup>st</sup> October 2003, however for livestock 1<sup>st</sup> December 2003.

The target population was all the holdings exceeding the determined threshold in 2003 [at least 1 hectare utilised agricultural area or production of a certain proportion for sale (at least 2500 euro) or exceeding of certain physical thresholds]. The largest holdings above the optimal threshold (at least 273 ha UAA, 446 LSU or separately established economic size for certain types of farming) determined by Hidiroglou-method were included exhaustively. Rest units were observed by a random sample. Stratification was done by province or region, by dimension (UAA, LSU, ESU) and type of farming using a 'stepwise' procedure (set of refinements until reached the good efficiency). Sample size and Allocation were done by multivariate and multi-domain context of Neyman-method considering upper thresholds for the expected coefficients of variation for main variables at national and regional levels. The total number of observed units is about 55 000.

The data are multi-level checked. Item and unit non-response were handled by phone-check (in case of farms with high influence), by comparison between collected and administrative data and by mixed and hierarchical editing and imputation procedure (in case of farms with low influence).

For each activity ('enterprise') on a farm (for instance wheat, dairy cow or vineyard), a standard gross margin (SGM) is estimated, based on the area (or the number of heads) and a regional coefficient. The sum of such margins in a farm is its economic size, expressed in European Size Units (ESU). 1 ESU is equal to 1200 euros.

Due to differences in the coverage of units of less than 1 ESU across Member States, these data are not comparable between countries. That is why the present analysis and graphs focus on the holdings of at least one ESU.

Each farm is classified in the community typology by its economic size and its type of farming, depending on the share of each enterprise in its economic size. For instance, a farm where breeding sows account for more than 2/3 of the economic size is classified as specialist pig rearing (type 5011). Depending on the level of aggregation, farms are grouped into 8 to 70 types.

Annual working unit (AWU) means the labour force working yearly like a worker employed on full time basis, it is 1800 hours (225 working days of 8 working hours per day).

The date of extraction of the data used for this Statistics in Focus corresponds to the date of completion of the manuscript.
