Winter season tourism trends 2010-2011

In the 2010-11 winter season, tourism recorded positive growth rates in most of the EU and EFTA countries, compared with the same period in 2009-2010. This trend is confirmed both by the number of nights spent in hotels and similar establishments, and by the net occupancy rates of bed-places in these establishments.


Comparing the monthly figures for the 2010-2011 winter season with the previous year, 22 million more nights (+4.2 %) were spent in hotels and similar establishments in the European Union. The highest increase was observed in Lithuania (+30.8 %), followed by Latvia (+19.8 %) and

Estonia (+17.5 %), while a decline was reported by the United Kingdom (-2.5 %) and Austria (-0.3 %).

Almost three-quarters of the total nights in hotels and similar establishments in the EU-27 were spent in five countries: Germany, Spain (both 16.8 %), France (14.2 %), Italy (14.1 %) and the United Kingdom (11.4 %).

The most popular destinations for foreign tourists during the winter season 2010-2011 were Spain, Italy and Austria, together accounting for half of all nights spent by non-residents in the EU-27.

Nights spent by residents and non-residents

In all Member States, except Austria, the number of nights spent by non-residents (foreign visitors) increased in the winter season 2010-2011.

The highest share of non-residents was recorded in Malta and Cyprus (93.7 % and 89.5 % respectively), while it was particularly low in Sweden (19.4 %), Romania (20.0 %) and Germany (21.6 %).

In terms of nights spent by residents (people travelling inside their own country) in hotels and similar establishments, domestic tourism increased during the 2010-2011 winter season in most Member States, with the exception of the United Kingdom (-6.6 %), Cyprus (-6.2 %), Portugal (-4.2 %), Italy (-2.8%) and Malta (-0.3 %).

Net occupancy rates of bed places highest in Austria

Compared with the same months of the previous year, net occupancy rates of bed places in the European Union increased by 0.7 percentage points during the 2010-2011 winter season. These rates ranged from 13.2 % in Cyprus (January) to 59.7 % in Austria (February).

In most of the countries April (Easter) was the month with the highest occupancy rates. Austria, Malta, Spain and the Netherlands reached net occupancy rates of bed places of more than 50 % in the peak month, while in Romania, Latvia, Slovakia and Lithuania the corresponding rates were less than 30 %.



Methodology

CONCEPTS AND DEFINITIONS

Net occupancy rate

The net occupancy rate of bed places in one month is obtained by dividing total overnight stays by the product of the bed places on offer and the number of days when the bed places are actually available for use (net of seasonal closures and other temporary closures for decoration, by police order, etc.) for the same group of establishments, multiplying the quotient by 100 to express the result as a percentage. Not to be confused with the bedroom occupancy rate, obtained by dividing the total number of bedrooms used during the reference period by the total number of bedrooms available for the reference period (i.e. a single person in a double room counts as 50% bed-places occupancy but 100% bedroom occupancy).

Hotels and similar establishments

Hotels, apartment hotels, motels, roadside inns, beach hotels and other similar establishments which provide hotel services including more than bed-making and cleaning of the room and sanitary facilities. Similar establishments are other similar types of accommodation which is let per room and has a limited number of hotel-type services, including bed-making and cleaning of rooms and sanitary facilities, on a daily basis.
