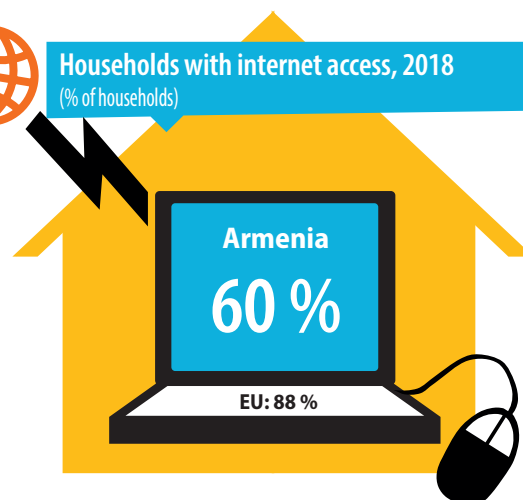

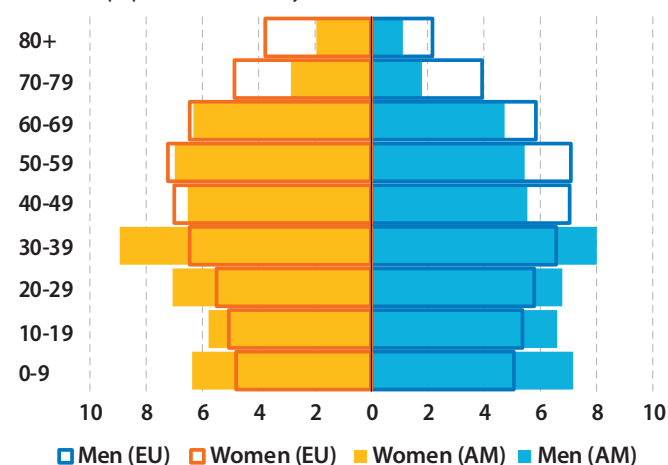

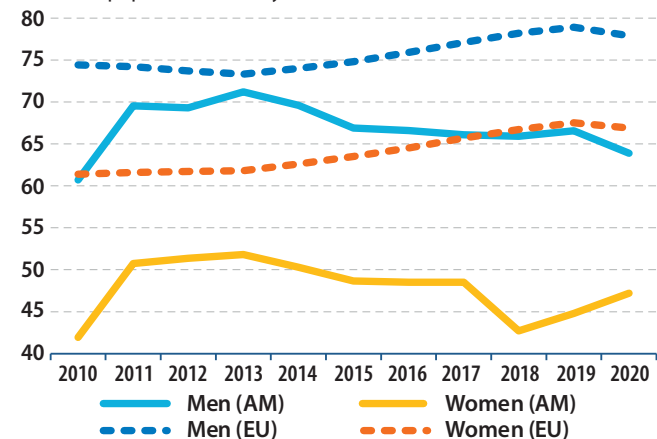
Population by age group, Armenia and EU, 2020

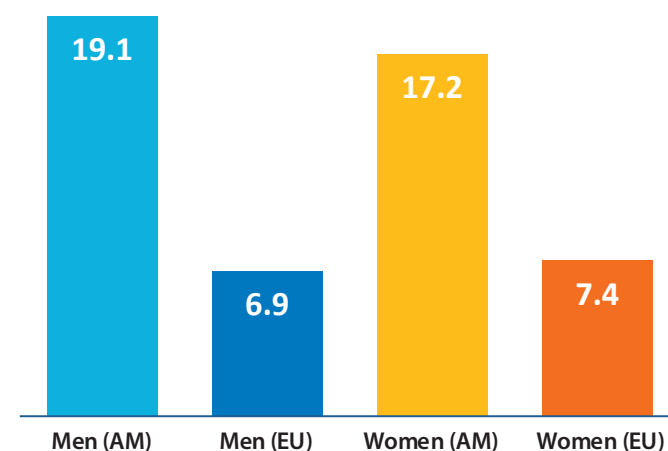

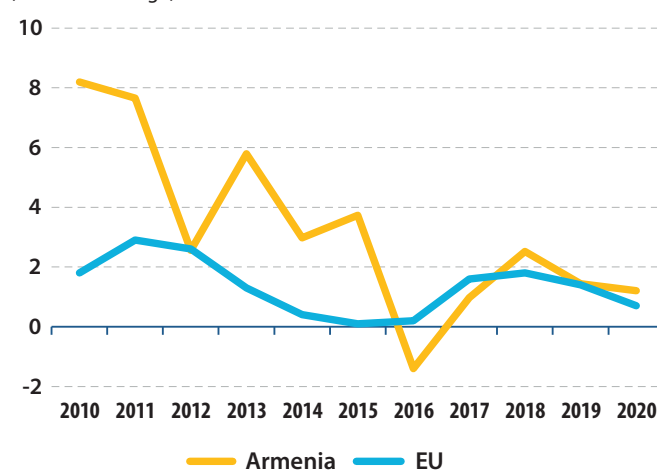
Unemployment rate, Armenia and EU, 2020

(% of active population 15-74 years old)



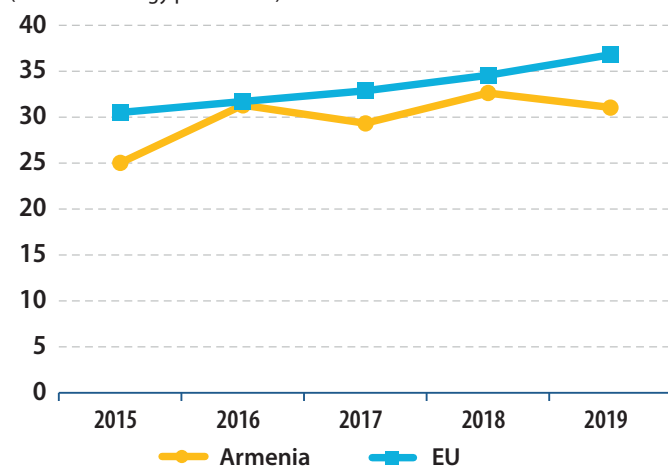
Consumer price inflation, Armenia and EU

(% annual change)



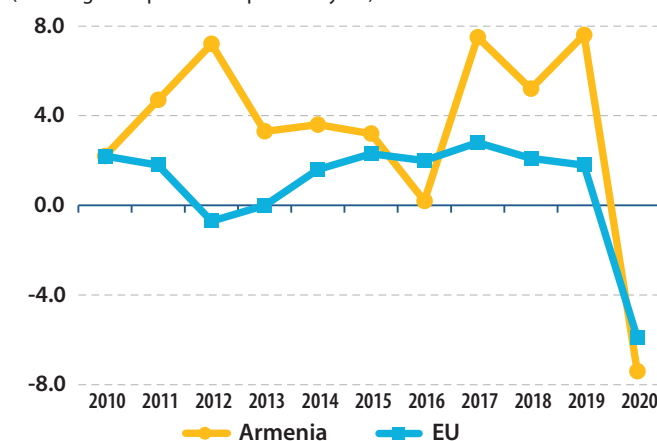

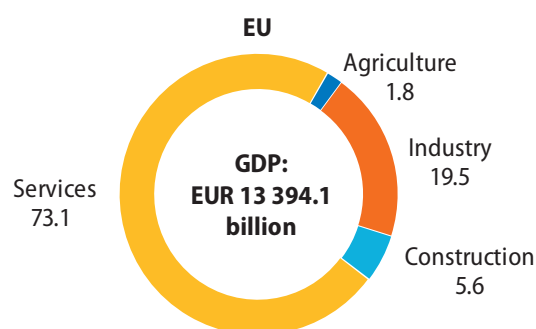
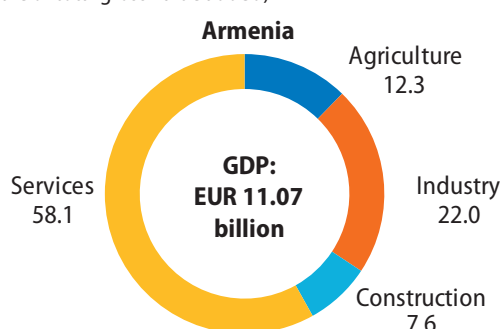
Real change in gross domestic product, Armenia and EU

(% of households)



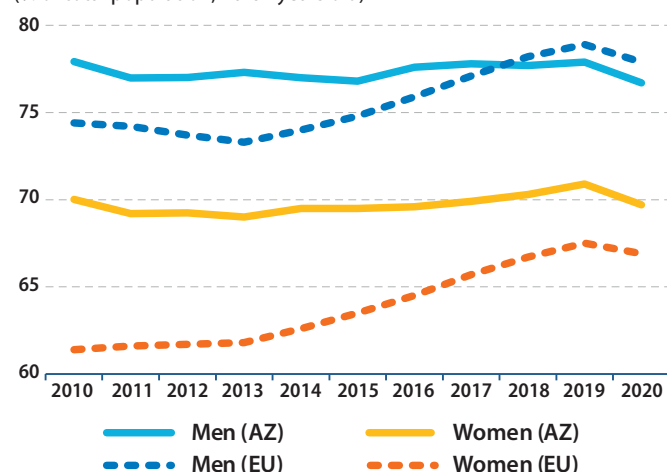
Population by age group, Azerbaijan and EU, 2020

(% of total population, 1 January)



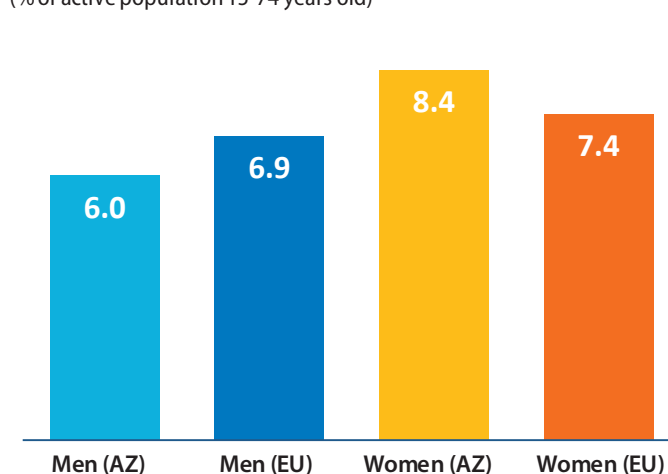
Employment rate, Azerbaijan and EU

(% of total population, 20-64 years old)



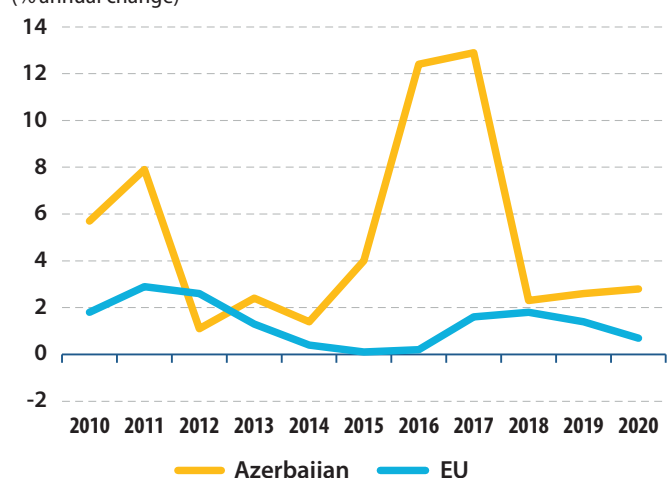

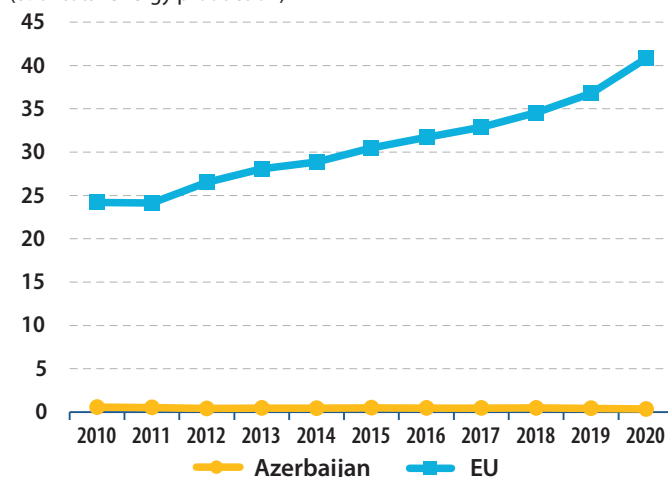

(% annual change)



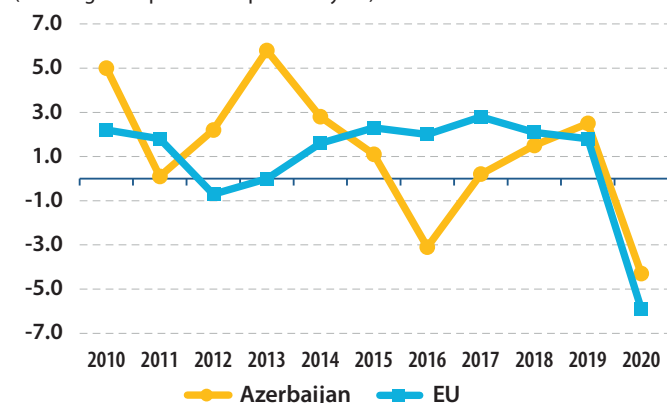

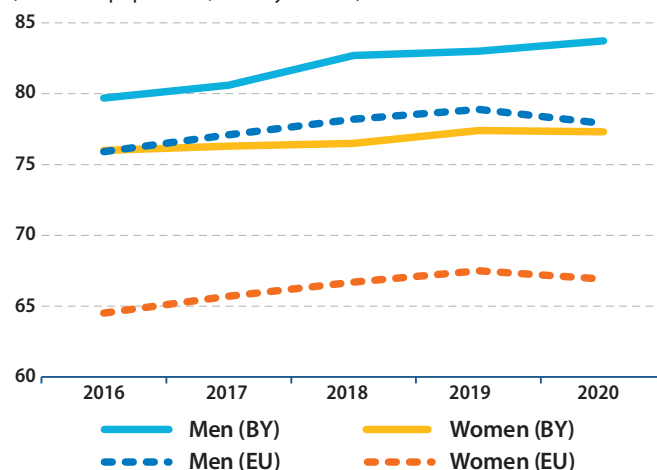
Population by age group, Belarus and EU, 2019

(% of total population, 1 January)



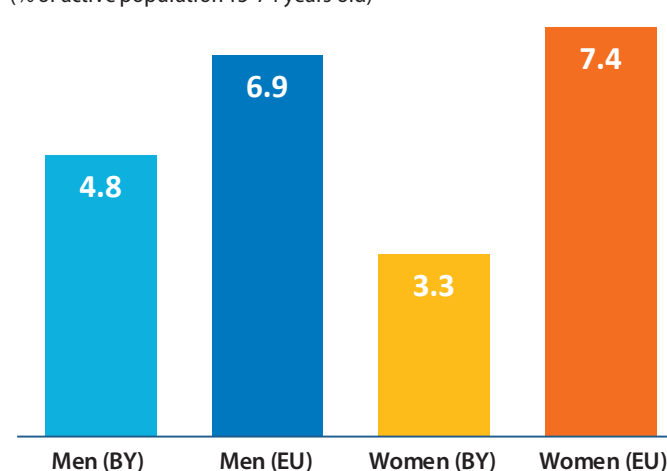
Employment rate, Belarus and EU

(% of total population, 20-64 years old)



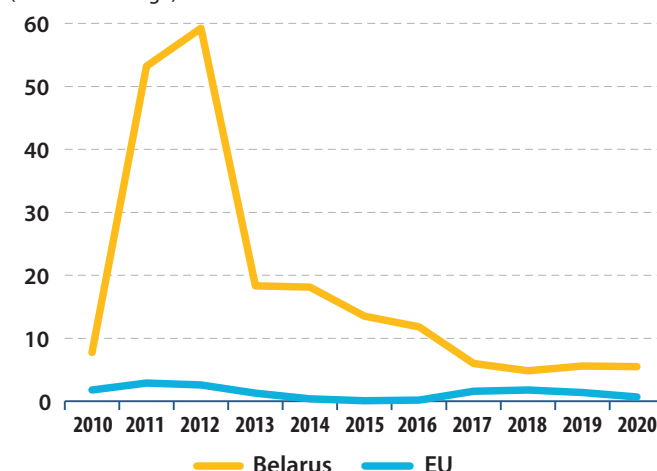

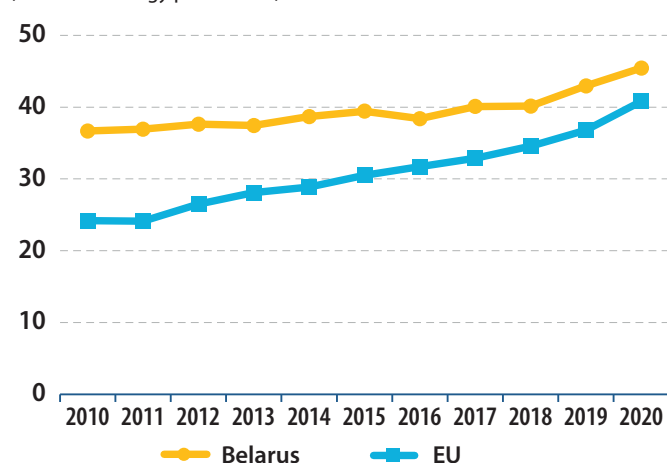
Consumer price inflation, Belarus and EU

(% annual change)



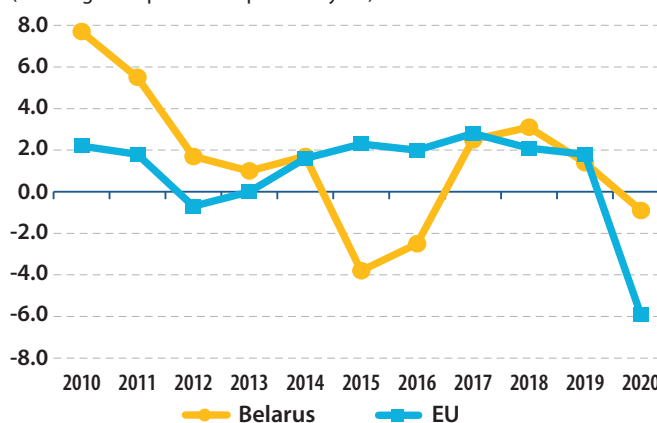

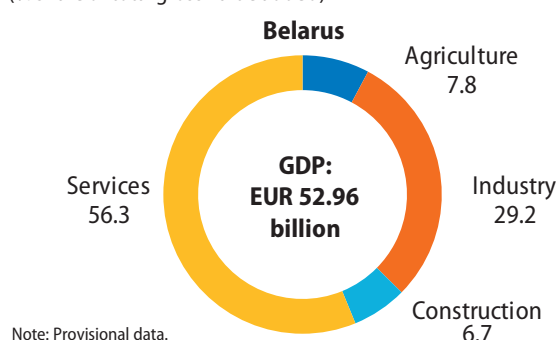

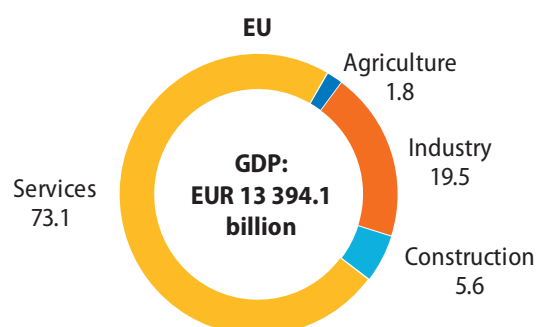

Distribution of the economy by sector, Belarus and EU, 2020

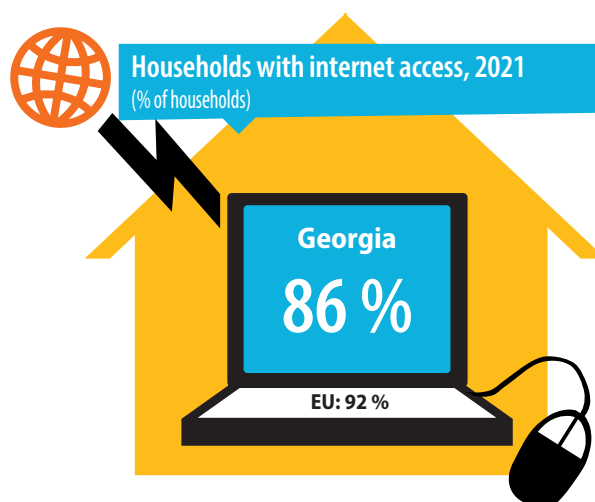
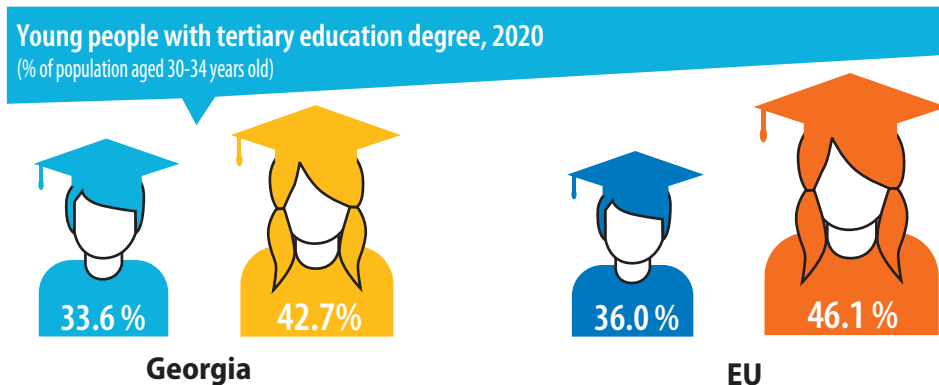
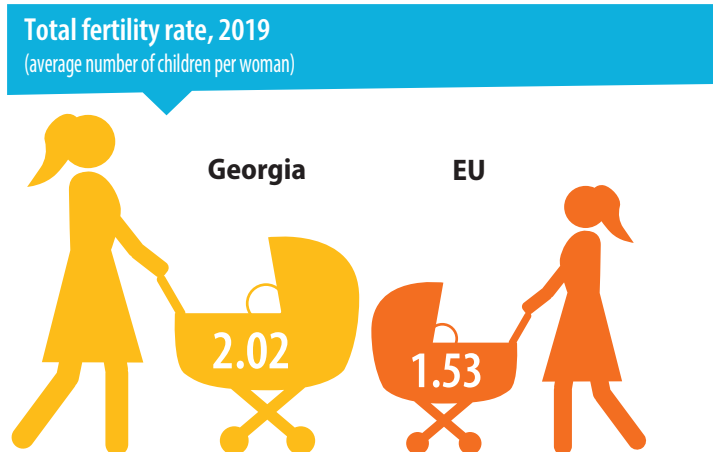
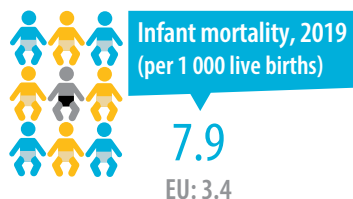
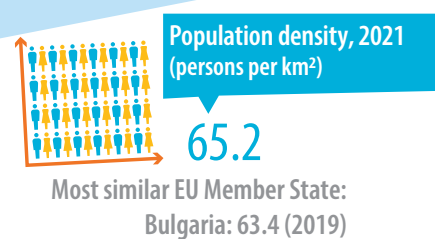
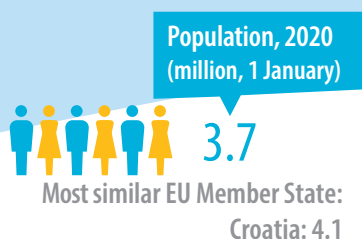
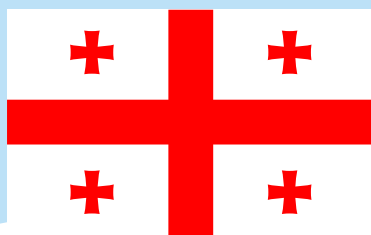

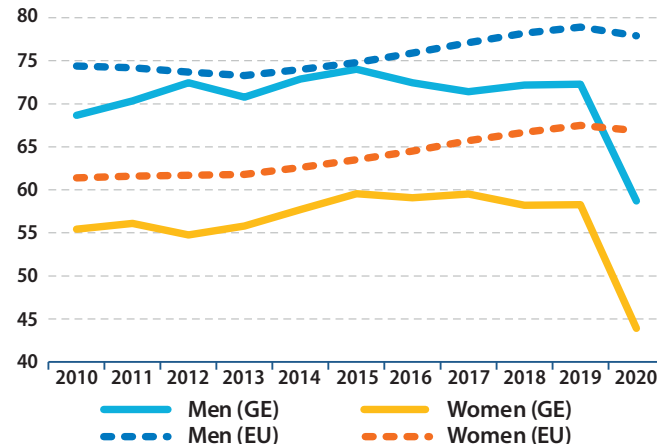
Population by age group, Georgia and EU, 2020

Employment rate, Georgia and EU

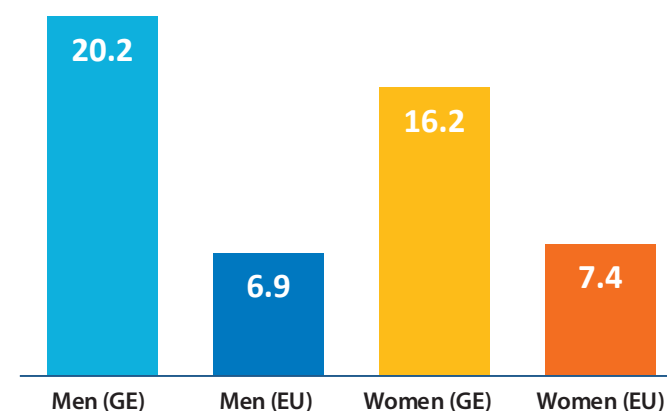

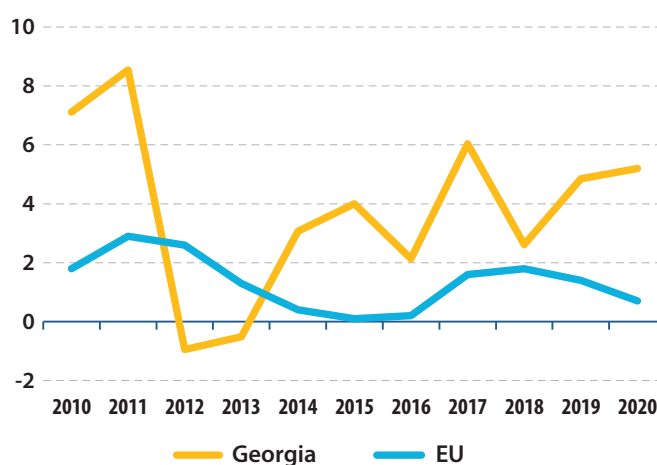

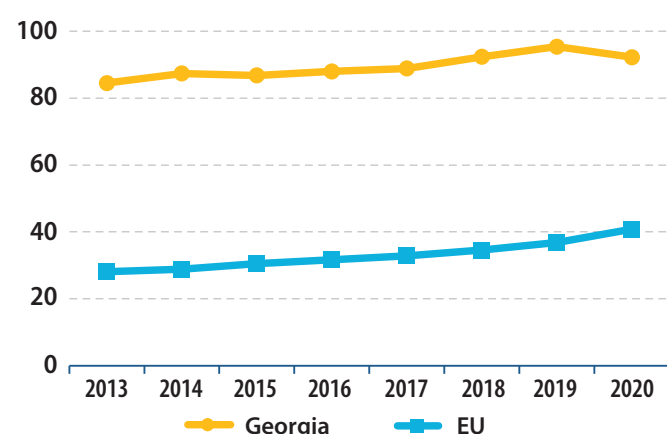
Consumer price inflation, Georgia and EU

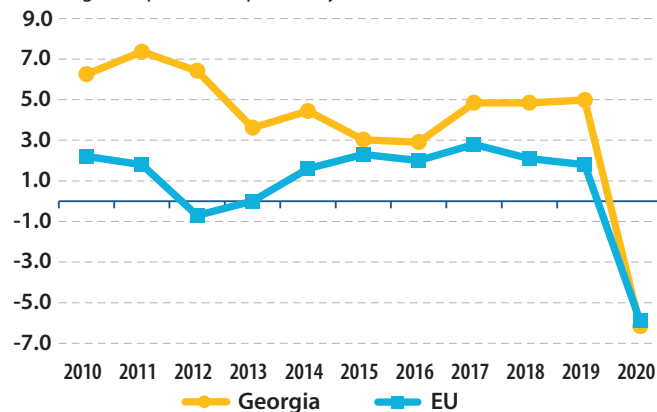

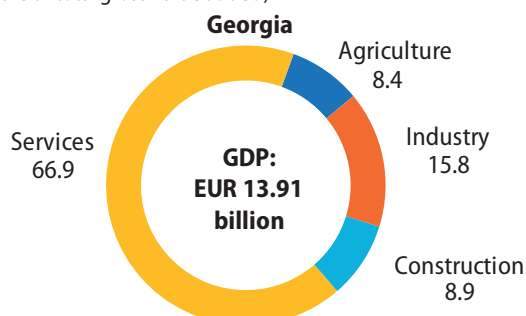

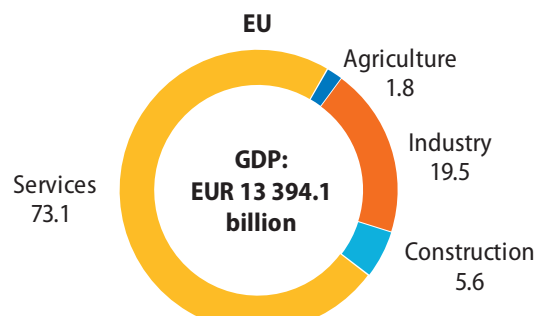

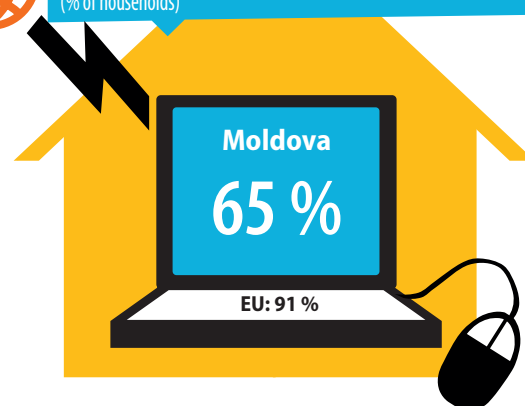

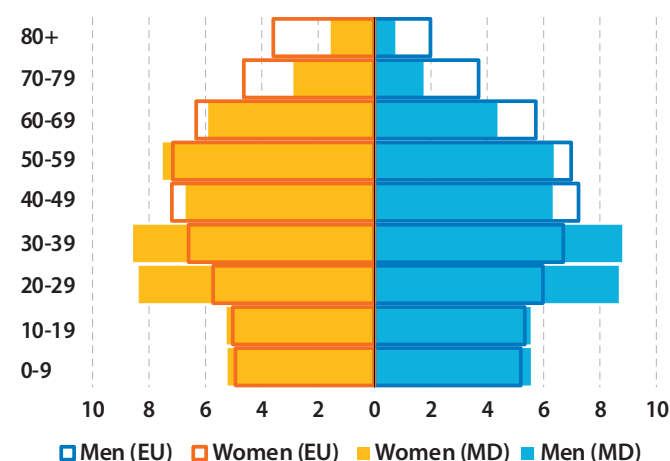

(% of households)



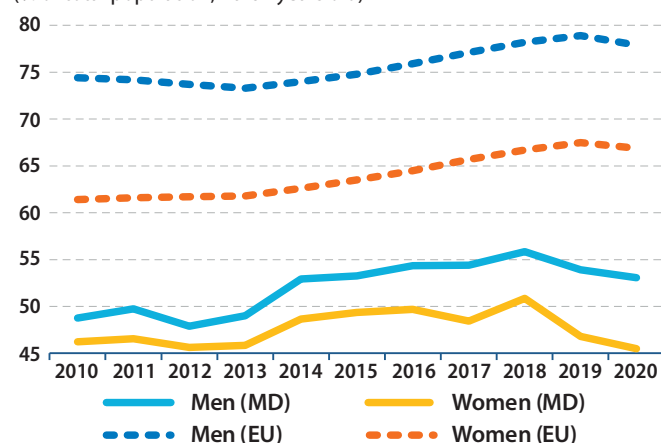
Population by age group, Moldova and EU, 2017

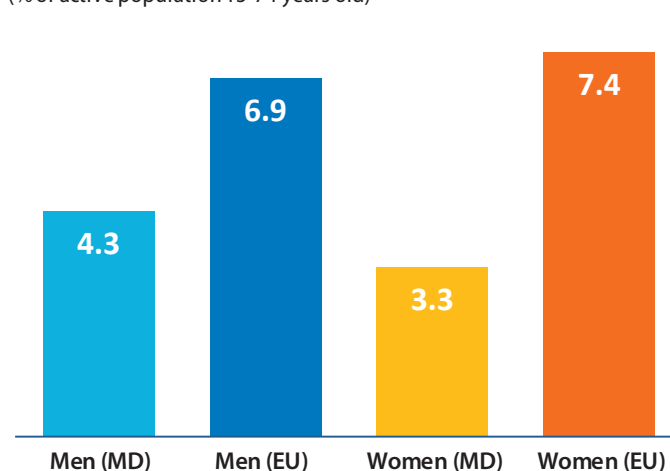

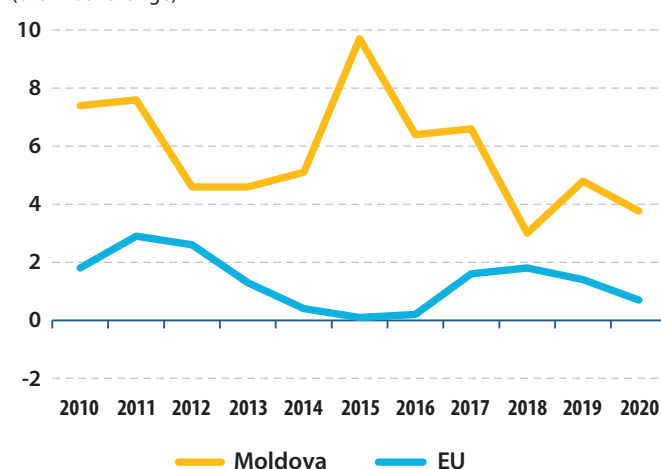
Unemployment rate, Moldova and EU, 2020

(% of active population 15-74 years old)



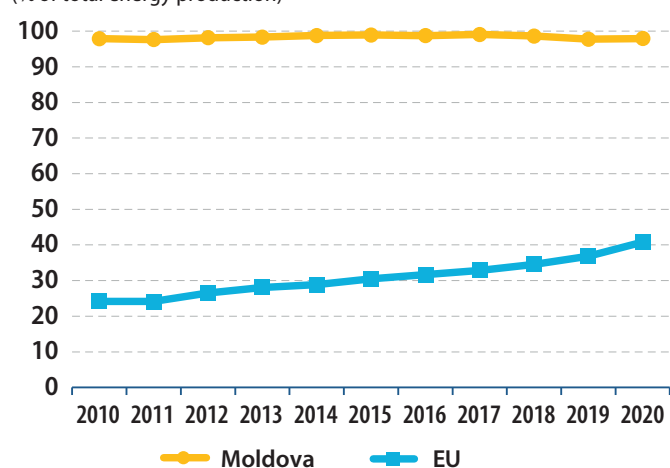
Consumer price inflation, Moldova and EU

(% annual change)



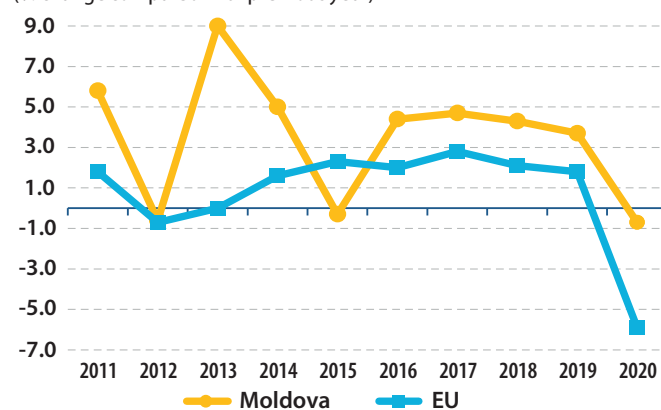

(% of households)



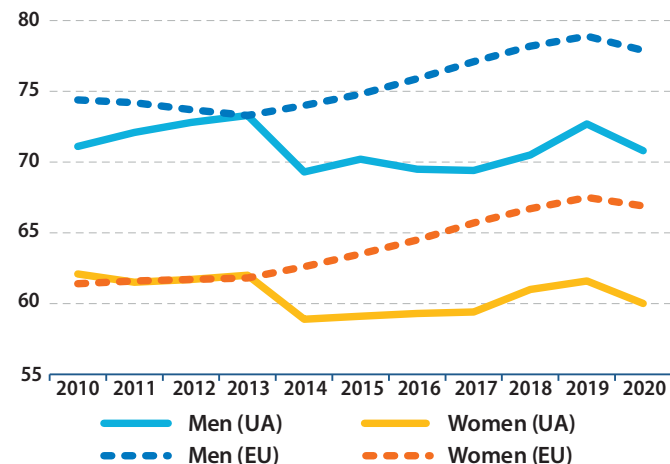
Population by age group, Ukraine and EU, 2020

(% of total population, 1 January)



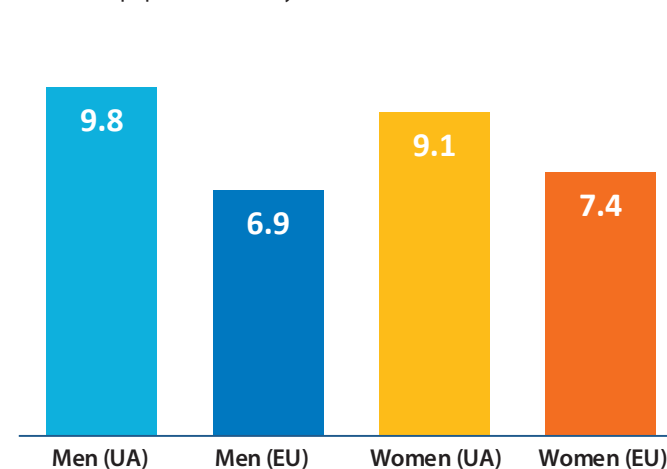
Employment rate, Ukraine and EU

(% of total population, 20-64 years old)



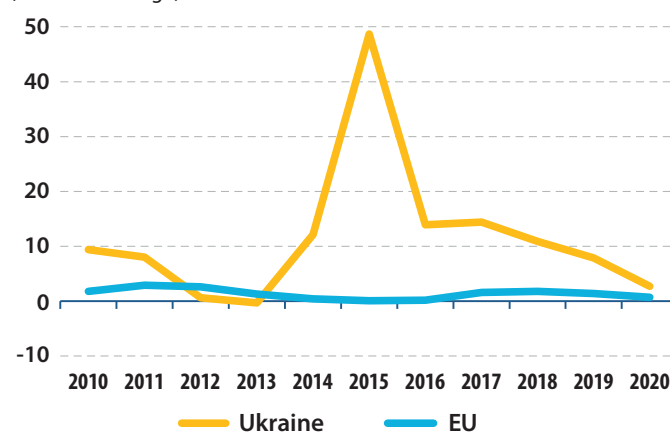

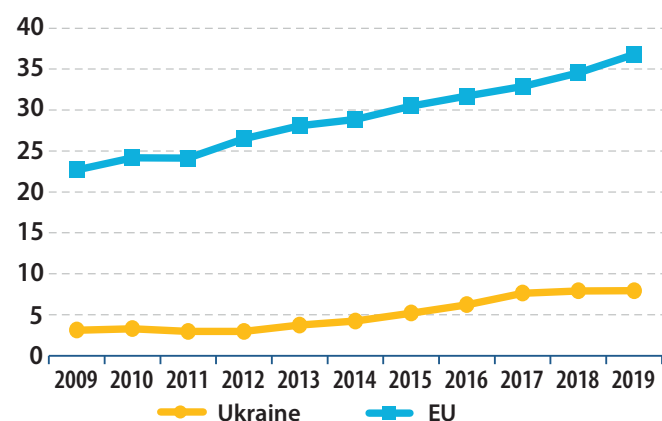

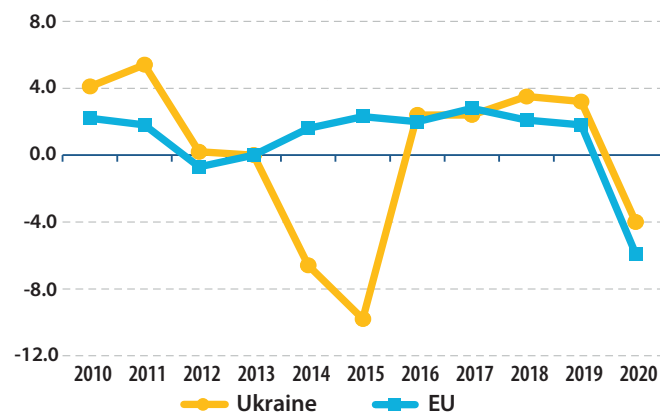
(% of total energy production)

Real change in gross domestic product, Ukraine and EU

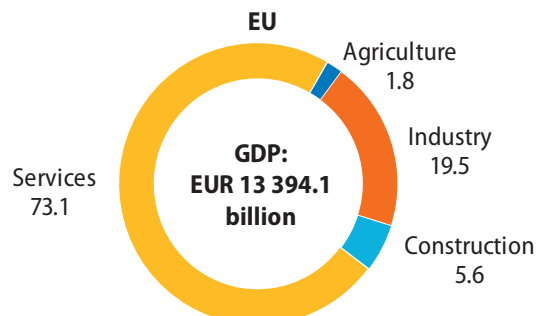
(% change compared with previous year)

Statistical cooperation with the European Neighbourhood Policy-East countries

European Neighbourhood Policy (ENP)

The European Neighbourhood Policy (ENP), established in 2004, reflects the European Union's (EU) wish to build on common interests with partner countries and commitment to work jointly in key priority areas, including in the promotion of democracy, rule of law, respect for human rights, and social cohesion. Through the ENP, the EU offers partner countries potential greater access to the EU's market and regulatory framework, standards and internal agencies and programmes.

Eastern Partnership (EaP)

On 2 July 2021, the European Commission and the EU High Representative for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy set out the [Eastern Partnership: a Renewed Agenda](#) for cooperation with the EU's Eastern partners. It builds on the Joint Communication [Eastern Partnership policy beyond 2020: Reinforcing Resilience – an Eastern Partnership that delivers for all](#) (March 2020) and the Joint Staff Working Document [Recovery, resilience and reform: post 2020 Eastern Partnership priorities](#) (July 2021). It will be underpinned by an Economic and Investment plan.

The [Joint Declaration of the Eastern Partnership Summit 'Recovery, Resilience and Reform'](#) of 15 December 2021 reaffirms strong commitment to a strategic, ambitious and forward-looking Eastern Partnership.

Statistics Through Eastern Partnership (STEP)

Statistics Through Eastern Partnership (STEP) is an EU-funded regional cooperation programme in statistics for the Eastern Partnership (EaP) countries Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova and Ukraine.

STEP aims at strengthening the statistical evidence base through more and better quality official statistics.

STEP helps the partner countries' national statistical institutes (NSIs) to strengthen their institutional capacity and to produce and disseminate comparable and reliable statistics in line with European and international norms and standards in areas such as macroeconomic, social, business and trade statistics.

STEP's ultimate goal is to support evidence-based policymaking. It aims to ensure that statistical evidence is behind policy decisions and will work to further develop cooperation and coordination within the national statistical systems of the partner countries.

Geographical coverage of ENP-East countries

The data and their denomination in no way constitute the expression of an opinion by the European Commission on the legal status of a country or territory or on the delimitation of its frontiers.

- The data for Georgia exclude the regions of Abkhazia and South Ossetia over which Georgia does not exercise control.
- Data for Moldova exclude areas over which the government of the Republic of Moldova does not exercise control.
- Data for Ukraine generally have a break in series in 2014, since they exclude the illegally annexed Autonomous Republic of Crimea and the City of Sevastopol and territories which are not under control of the Ukrainian government.
