### The Eurostat website — Your free access to European statistics

Eurostat provides free access to its data. It publishes harmonised statistics on the European Union (EU) and the euro area and offers a comparable, reliable and objective portrayal of social and economic trends. Eurostat collects data from national statistical authorities according to EU-wide methodologies. Data are, therefore, genuinely comparable.

### How to access Eurostat's data?

The homepage: ec.europa.eu/eurostat shows at a glance the wide range of information provided: from the latest news releases to themes currently in the spotlight.



# Tables

Tables are pre-defined insofar as the user cannot select additional indicators. All the tables on Eurostat's website open using an application called TGM (Tables, Graphs and Maps). Tables are split into two main sections in the Data Navigation tree — Tables by themes and Tables on EU policy.



### Tables, Graphs and Maps (TGM)



The TGM interface is a self-contained interface used for viewing, printing and downloading data which runs in a web browser. The interface allows users to define the style of


graphs and maps, and to save these using bookmarks.



# Database

Data can also be viewed from multi-dimensional databases — using the **Data Explorer**.

This tool allows users to select across all dimensions of a database: geographical dimension, time, measurements, units. There may be a variety of other dimensions depending on the specific data set in question (for example, breakdowns by gender, age, or type of economic activity/sector).

A collection of constantly updated articles which together make up an encyclopedia of European statistics, completed by a statistical glossary clarifying all terms used and by numerous links to further information — a portal for occasional and regular users.
