Comments on this type of double counting:

In Cyprus, the pension system is composed of a basic pension scheme (scheme 01: the Social Insurance Scheme) and several other supplementary schemes. A beneficiary is registered to the basic scheme and also to another (only one) supplementary scheme. Each supplementary scheme benefits different groups of beneficiaries mainly according to the nature of their occupation. This situation prevents someone from benefitting from more than one supplementary scheme.

To avoid double counting and according to the methodology of the module, the beneficiaries of each supplementary scheme were not aggregated. The only exceptions occurred in scheme 04 (supplementary scheme) in which certain groups of beneficiaries, without any other sources of income, were aggregated to the basic scheme.

The Social Insurance Services provided the actual data in such a manner so as to avoid double counting. The Government Treasury provided CYSTAT with a detailed register and CYSTAT in turn, processed this data extracting the information for the number of (unique) pensioners (without any double counting). For schemes 05 and 06 this data was collected through the use of survey questionnaires and were then processed and analysed by CYSTAT.

The total number of pension beneficiaries is not equal to the sum of the total beneficiaries in each pension category, given the fact that treatment of double counting took place.
