Sample Survey Economic Indicators of Agricultural Enterprises (directly used). Survey unit is enterprise whose main activity is agriculture. Data are directly comparable to Structural Business Statistics.

The main data source for labour force is Farm Structure Survey. We use the estimation that family labour is non-salaried and other labour is salaried.

According to the Farm Structure Survey rules unpaid mutual aid is excluded.

Value of salaries and social security taxes of legal persons is received from the sample survey Economic Indicators of Agricultural Enterprises. On the basis of these data the average salary is calculated. The value of total paid labour of natural persons is received by multiplying number of paid labour from Farm Structure Survey by average salary of legal persons. The percentage of relevant social security taxes is established by the law.
