
Foreign-born people and their descendants

Statistics Explained

The publication **Foreign-born people and their descendants** is an online Eurostat publication based on data collected by Eurostat from the EU Labour Force Survey (EU-LFS) and from the ad-hoc module (with eight-yearly periodicity) of the EU-LFS on the labour market situation of migrants and their immediate descendants implemented in 2021.
