

Glossary: Statistical classification of economic activities in the European Community (NACE)

Statistics Explained

The **Statistical classification of economic activities in the European Community**, abbreviated as **NACE**, is the classification of economic activities in the [European Union \(EU\)](#); the term NACE is derived from the French **Nomenclature statistique des activités économiques dans la Communauté européenne**. Various NACE versions have been developed since 1970.

NACE is a four-digit classification providing the framework for collecting and presenting statistical data according to economic activity in a wide variety of European statistics in the economic, social, environmental, and agricultural domains.

In 2023, NACE Revision 2 update 1 (NACE Rev. 2.1) was established. It will be progressively rolled out in all relevant statistical domains from 2025 onwards.
