Description	You type	You get
Italic text	'''italic'' <i>(note: type twice ', not " !)'</i>	<i>italic</i>
Bold text	'''bold'''	<b>bold</b>
Bold and italic	'''''bold & italic'''''	<b><i>bold &amp; italic</i></b>
Internal link <i>(within Statistics Explained)</i>	[[Name of page]] [[Glossary:Name page Text to display]] of	Name of page Text to display
External link <i>(to other website, for instance www.example.org)</i>	[http://www.example.org Text to display] [http://www.example.org] http://www.example.org	Text to display [1] <a href="http://www.example.org">http://www.example.org</a>
Redirect to another page (usually in 'Glossary' namespace)	#REDIRECT [[Glossary:Target page]]	Glossary:Target page
Redirect to other section with a header within the same page	[[#Target_header Target header]]	Target header
Creating a footnote (reference)	To create a footnote (reference), use this format: Article text<ref>Text of the footnote (including any links, for instance [http://www.example.org Link text]).</ref>	2*Article text <sup>1</sup>
	To reuse the same note, reuse the name with a trailing slash: Article text.<ref name="test" />	
	To display notes, add either of these lines to the References section<references/> Template:T1
