

# Glossary: International classification for health accounts (ICHA)

Statistics Explained

The **International classification for health accounts** , abbreviated as **ICHA** , is a nomenclature managed by the **OECD** . Its purpose is to define, within the context of the **system of national accounts** :

- *healthcare financing agents* : who is paying?
- *healthcare by function* : for which services and goods?
- *healthcare service provider industries* : who provides the services?

## Example

*ICHA code: Functions of healthcare*

HC.1: Services of curative care

HC.1.1: In-patient curative care

HC.1.2: Day cases of curative care

HC.1.3: Out-patient curative care

HC.1.3.1: Basic medical and diagnostic services

HC.1.3.2: Out-patient dental care

HC.1.3.3: All other specialized healthcare

HC.1.3.9: All other out-patient curative care

HC.1.4: Services of curative home care

HC.2: Services of rehabilitative care
