

Glossary:Reuse of waste

Statistics Explained

Reuse of waste means any operation by which products or components that are not [waste](#) are used again for the same purpose for which they were conceived.

The differentiation between the terms **reuse** , **recycling** and **recovery** is important for the understanding and application of the targets stated in [EU](#) waste legislation.

Definitions for **recycling** and **reuse** in waste specific Directives partially deviate from the corresponding definitions of the [Waste Framework Directive](#) :

1. The term **recycling** specified in waste specific Directives does in particular not include backfilling operations.
2. **Reuse** as defined in the [Packaging Directive 94/62/EC](#) and the [WEEE Directive 19/2012](#) of the European Parliament and of the Council of 4 July 2012 on waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE) comprises specifications the Waste Framework Directive does not include.
