## A Introduction

---

### **About trade between Australia and the EU**

In 2017, Australia ranked as the 18th largest trade in goods partner of the EU, while the EU represented Australia's second-largest trading partner after China. Total trade in goods accounted for Euro 47.7 billion in 2017 and total trade in services for Euro 27.1 billion in 2016. 59% of the EU's imports from Australia are primary products, while EU exports to Australia are primarily manufactures (87%).

### **About the Australia-EU free trade agreement negotiations**

In June 2018, the European Union (EU) and Australia launched negotiations about a bilateral free trade agreement (FTA); these negotiations are currently ongoing. They not only aim at reducing barriers to trade in goods and services, but are also hoped to result in an agreement that will comprise provisions on a number of trade-related topics, including trade and sustainable development. Details about the negotiations, including the issues covered and text proposals are available from the [European Commission DG Trade](#) and the [Australian Government](#).

The negotiations are accompanied by an independent study which aims to assess the sustainability impact that the FTA could have.

### **About Sustainability Impact Assessments (SIAs)**

SIAs analyse the potential economic, social, human rights and environmental impact of trade agreements being negotiated by the European Union (EU). They are based on a robust analysis of the changes that are likely to be caused by the trade agreement in the EU, the partner country and specified regions, such as the EU Outermost Regions or Least Developed Countries. Equally important, they include wide-ranging consultations with stakeholders in the EU and the partner country. SIA findings and recommendations feed into the negotiations, helping negotiators to optimise the related policy choices.

The SIA in support of the EU-Australia FTA negotiations is implemented by BKP Economic Advisors, a German-based economic research and consulting firm, in cooperation with Trade Impact, Trinomics, the Danish Institute for Human Rights, IES and Global Sustainable Futures.
