

The expected results are: increased awareness through reaching 300,000 people, having the code of conduct signed by 20,000 stakeholders; ensuring that some 600 diving teachers and school teachers highlight the problem in their curriculum; training of 200 coast guard officers and 100 teachers; organisation of litter clean-ups on 160 beaches and 128 sea floors with 3,000 participants; assessment of litter clean-ups on 100 beaches and 128 sea floors; at least 640 beach and coastal operators and local authorities committed to organising more than 1,000 clean-ups; a mapping of critical areas of litter accumulation and the identification and ranking of its types and sources for policy purposes.
