Context

- Severe affordable housing crisis in Brussels.
- Lack of social housing only
 7% of housing stock.
- Existing schemes for home ownership no longer cover low-income groups.







Origins

Project emerged from associations working in disadvantaged neighbourhoods. Support from the Brussels-Capital regional government who subsidised a feasibility study.

CLTB created in December 2012.







Vision for the City

Emancipation is an essential element – Roots in US Civil Rights Movement.

Land is a common good –
Perpetually held by a Foundation to be used in the interest of local communities.








The CLTB Model

Innovative model of ownership – Land is separated from building.

Perpetual affordability for low-income households through a resale mechanism that captures increases in value.

Community-building is central to CLTB. **Functional diversity** and openness to the neighbourhood.







Target Public

Acquisition of new or renovated flats by households eligible for social housing — Four different categories based on income.


Participatory process — Future inhabitants are involved in projects from the onset.







Structure



Shared democratic governance – Three tiers including inhabitants, civil society, and political authorities.

Two legal entities – A Foundation and a non-profit organisation.





Financing Model

Housing production subsidised by Brussels-Capital Region who allocates funding for the acquisition of land and the construction of housing units.







Current Status



Housing projects:

- One completed project (9 households).
- Three projects in construction (43 units).
- Five projects in preparation (77 units).

Members:


- More than 400 (candidate) owners.
- Around 170 supporting members.
- About 30 partner associations.



Future Prospects

Scaling-up in Brussels.
Exploration of additional sources of funding.
Expansion to other types of housing (rental, intergenerational,...) or non-housing (community centres, social economy companies,...)
