Part 1 EU indicators on local-regional level

Comments from city level perspective: Questions

- Are you comparing integration data from your city with the situation in other cities, and if yes, does this benchmarking go beyond the national context?
- What are your needs (if any) for comparable integration data on city level across countries?
- What degree of European harmonisation would be necessary to make comparisons useful for you (in terms of specific issue areas, definitions of key concepts, key indicators, target groups,...)?





Part 1 EU indicators on local-regional level

General Debate on possible recommendations: Questions

• What are the limitations of the current system & framework?

Key reasons for limited availability of LFS/EU-SILC-based EU integration indicators on infra-national level? (sample size, data quality?) – interest (lack of?) of NSIs in survey sizes that would allow for more results on infra-national level? - etc. ???

• How to fully use the potentials of the current system & framework?

- Continuous updating of indicators at infra-national level by Eurostat? Recommendations for NSIs for e.g. bigger sample sizes/oversampling (big cities?) for LFS, EU-SILC? - Proposals for specific ad-hoc modules? - etc. ???
- What are the options to overcome the limitations of the current system & framework?
 - Funding incentives for NSIs to go beyond current sample sizes? Proposals to amend EU Regulations on LFS, EU-SILC? – Intensified data exchange among NSIs – More use of administrative datasets in EU integration indicators? - etc. ???



General Debate: Questions

- How can the presented (existing and potential) instruments become part of a "toolbox" for cities?
- What should be the key characteristics of a "toolbox mechanism", e.g. portal to all relevant tools, databases, instruments; source of recommendations, key definitions, ready-to-use modules,?
- Where could such a one-stop shop for cities be situated? (Existing tools? Platform aligned to Commission or to cities' networks or associations?)
- Potentials & needs regarding exploitation of European sample surveys feedback and expectations, additional surveys to include in assessment?





Part 3 Know-how transfer & instruments for mutual learning

Comments from city level perspective: Questions

- Has your city been involved in networks, projects or other exchange activities dealing with integration data, indicators, monitoring systems, evidence-based policy-making etc.?
- If yes, have these activities focused on the national and/or the European context, and how did your city gain from these experiences?
- What are your needs and gaps in terms of data availability (or tools for data gathering), where support from an international level or exchange with other cities would be helpful?







Working Group Meeting 3 (April 2018)

- Focus city experiences & needs: in-depth discussion of local approaches & multi-level aspects (incl. additional cities!?)
- Exploration of mutual benefits for cities interested in intensified city-to-city exchange, as contribution to options for mutual learning/toolbox
- Conclusions from Meeting 2 on EU-wide indicators on urban/regional level, discussion of draft options/recommendations & draft arguments for core set of EU indicators on urban/regional level
