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Monitoring immigrant integration

- Continuous monitoring of population changes based on population register data.
 - Foreign background, registered mother tongue, nationality, refugees and asylum seekers; age and gender; regional variation within the city.
- Continuous monitoring of immigrant integration based on population register data.
 - Housing, education, employment, income.
- Biennial (planned) monitoring of immigrant integration based on population register data.
 - Employment, housing, income.
- Use of survey data gathered by other (national) actors.
- Specific studies and research projects.

Zaragoza indicators in use

- Employment indicators using mainly Finnish register data.
- Education indicators are problematic because deficits in the national register. (Early school leaving better available; PISA results in use.)
- Social inclusion indicators: income indicators and property ownership in use.
- Active citizenship indicators: naturalisation information in use; election indicators based on external research.
- Welcoming society indicators: not in regular use.
