Title	To Empower the Community in response to Alcohol Threats (ECAT)
Main Objective	To raise the effectiveness of alcohol prevention campaigns through the elaboration of tailored messages towards different target groups and through the embedding of the campaigns in a local alcohol policy and inclusive approach. By translating the gathered evaluated results of the national ECAT-prevention campaigns into a general applicable manual of guidelines, an important added value is created on a European level. This general objective will be achieved via the following strategic objectives: - to define prior target groups and topics through the conduct of a quick scan for community analysis (social, epidemiological, behavioural and environmental assessment) - to design a local community alcohol policy based on the results of the community analysis, including an information and sensitisation campaign directed at the prior target groups and focused on prior topics - to develop evidence based guidelines for tailor-made alcohol prevention campaigns on a local community level - to set up local, cross-sectoral networks of stakeholders (e.g. general practitioners), in order to respond to the needs and questions of the target groups - to evaluate the reach, visibility and impact of the campaigns - to synthesise the best practices in a manual and to present the results and developed concept at a closing European conference.
