ECHA - Tasks

Will be an <u>independent</u> European regulatory Agency

Managing technical, scientific and administrative aspects of REACH

Will have certain decision making powers



ECHA - Committees

RAC and SEAC:

Prepare Agency's opinions on authorisation, restrictions, other REACH-related questions
on risks to human health or the environment,
on the socio-economic impact of possible legislative actions

Prepare Agency's opinions on proposals for harmonised C&L under Title X



ECHA – Results

Provides scientific & technical advice on chemicals

Delivers independent, scientific opinions to Commission



ECHA – SC s Relation (1)

Possibilities for ECHA to seek SC s scientific advice welcomed

 Focus on AD HOC BASIS instead of « automatism » as is the case under Existing Substances Regulation seems to be appropriate



ECHA – SC s Relation (2)

ECHA might seek advice:

- Methodological questions on RA
- New scientific approaches
- > Impact of new technologies
- > ...

SC s maintain capacities in particular in Risk Assessment methodology would be welcomed



ECHA – Relations to Agencies (1)

Relations to other Agencies will primarily focus on:

Exchange of information and experiences

Establish working arrangements between ECHA and Agencies



ECHA – Relations to Agencies (2)

- Cooperation on Classification and Labelling and future GHS
- Cooperation concerning Plant Protection Products and Biocidal Products
- Exchange of information on data security
