Active Citizenship Network

- European network started in 2001.
- Promotes the participation of citizens' organizations in European and national public policies.
- Over 90 partner organizations from 30 European countries.
- Set up and promoted by a national Italian organisation Cittadinanzattiva.

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Patients' Rights an EU issue or not

- Health services and thus Patients' Rights are normally considered only of national competence based on the principle of sussidiarity.
- European Court of Justice Ruling: ruled on patient getting treatment in other countries based on right of free movement of people and services (30 and 49–50 of the EC Treaty).
- Article 35 of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the EU and guarantee a "high level of human health protection".
- European Council: Convention on Human Rights and Biomedicine and Rec.(2000)5 citizen and patient participation.
- WHO Declaration on the Promotion of Patients' Rights in Europe.

EU Active Citizenship Approach

 Rights based: rights are transnational though health care systems are organised nationally.

- Alliance building

European Charter of Patients' Rights

- Bottom-up policy initiative (from a national citizens' view constructing a European vision). Drafted in 2002.
- Despite differences in healthcare systems the <u>same</u> <u>rights are at risk</u> in all EU countries
- Not only rights of patients but rather of all citizens (including users, family members, vulnerable population and all individuals residing in the EU) with respect to healthcare.
- Make <u>concrete art.35 EU Charter</u> of Fundamental Rights high level health protection.

EU Council Common Values and ACTIVE CITIZE Principles in EU Health Systems

11 of the 14 patients' rights

Values: Universality, Access to quality care, equity and solidarity. (prevention)

Operative Principles:

- Quality (standards, innovation)
- 2. Safety
- Care based on evidence and ethics
- 4. Patient involvement (choice, information, consent)
- 5. Redress (complain and compensation)
- 6. Privacy and confidentiality

European Charter of Patients' Rights

- Building a European Identity
- Instrument for awareness building, facilitating dialogue among different stakeholders and for setting standards.
- Used in national situations or on specific disease.
- 17 languages













Patients' Rights:

- Monitoring the 14 Patient Rights in 15 EU countries by citizens organisation: 174 indicators, Patients' Rights Matrix.
- To produce new information on the actual implementation of patients' rights at the EU level.
- To transform the traditional role of citizens from mere targets and users of health services to active citizens participating in the healthcare assessment.
- Existing data and information on health care at European level would be enriched with patients' rights-focused one. (standards)
- Financing of health structures conditioned to the respect of patients' rights.


European Patients' Rights Day

- To make commitment for concrete actions.






1° European Patients' Rights Day 2007

2° European Patients' Right Day

- 1. 80 events in 26 European countries (22 EU MS):
 - Seminars, conferences, Handing out information in hospitals, clinics, pharmacies, medical schools, Press Conferences, Meetings with national officials
 - Education-communication campaign "Patients' Rights-my rights" (Poland)
- Charter translated in 17 languages (available on our website)
- 3. European Conference in Gorizia, Italy "European Patients' Rights: a European and a national Challenge"
- Patronage of the European Parliament, European Commissioner of Health, EESC,





European Parliament

2 resolutions in 2007 called for the

- "adoption of a European charter of patients' rights into the framework in order to ensure that such rights are exercised in the practice of cross border and
- on the basis of existing charters in the Member States and of the work carried out by nongovernmental organisations.





Recognition by EESC

Opinion on Patient's rights that

- "Welcomes and acknowledges the European Charter of Patients' Rights, promoted by Active Citizenship Network
- Calls on the European Commission to establish a European Patients' Rights Day, "

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Points to Reflect on

"In discussing future strategies, our shared concern should be to protect the values and principles that underpin the health systems of the EU."

Health Ministers June 2006.

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Points to Reflect on

- Adopting a European Charter of Patients' Rights to reinforce the common Values and principles stated by Health Ministers and provide clarity for all citizens.
- Including information (indicators-standards) regarding patients' rights in EU and guaranteeing the active participation of citizens and patients in assessing and evaluating health care systems.
- Using patients' rights-based approach in dealing with new scenarios such as: information on drugs, use of biotechnologies.
