



As part of the European Green Deal, the Commission is currently preparing a new EU strategy on adaptation to climate change, which will work to identify and minimise the main risks, including to health. The Commission has just launched a public consultation on this strategy, and it also has published the new 'Climate Change and Health: Science to Policy' report on climate change impacts and adaptation in Europe.

This interactive webinar will present the EU's work in this field, including the collaborative EU observatory on climate change and health, which should be operational by the end of the year.

Leading experts from the European Commission's public health and climate directorates, the European Environmental Agency, the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control and the Commission's Joint Research Centre will take part. 
