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# CEF-TC-2015-1: eDelivery (Electronic delivery of documents)

- eDelivery's main goal is to ensure that Public Administrations can exchange any type of data and documents across borders
- A2A eDelivery can also be used in Administration to Business (A2B) and Business to Administration (B2A) scenarios
- The communication between Citizens (C2C) is out of scope of eDelivery

# eDelivery: 2015 call

- **Budget:** €1 Million
- **Funding:** 75% of eligible costs of the action. No pre-financing.
- **Estimated duration:** 1 year

# eDelivery: Legal framework

- REGULATION (EU) No 910/2014 of the European Parliament and the Council of 23 July 2014 on electronic identification and trust services for electronic transactions in the internal market and repealing Directive 1999/93/EC
- CEF DSI eDelivery aims at ensuring the deploying cross-border interoperable technical solutions for the secure electronic exchange of documents.
- Regulation (EU) n°910/2014 provides with the cross-border legal effect for qualified electronic registered delivery services → Presumption of the integrity of the data, the sending of that data by the identified sender, its receipt by the identified addressee and the accuracy of the date and time of sending and receipt
- In order to benefit from each other, the technical solutions deployed under the CEF eDelivery DSI are assessed to be compatible with the requirements of the Regulation for qualified electronic registered delivery services.

# eDelivery: Objectives (1/3)

The objective is to:

- ✓ **increase uptake and use of the eDelivery DSI**

by

- ✓ **supporting the setting up of additional access points throughout the EU and the EEA countries**

to

- ✓ **link to the EU core service platform**

with a view to

- ✓ **supporting the cross-border exchange of electronic documents between such entities as well as between such entities and citizens and businesses.**

## eDelivery: Objectives (2/3)

To meet the objectives, the eDelivery DSI proposes a gateway that

- ✓ can make a translation between national and European solutions in order to guarantee transactions.
  - ✓ should enable interoperability between the European level and the level of the Member States regardless the standards in use within each of the Member States.
- ➔ The eDelivery DSI provides with an interoperability solution to link national/EU solutions.

## eDelivery: Objectives (3/3)

- An access point is defined as an implementation of:
  - ✓ ebMS3/AS4 data exchange protocols described in implementations of the ebMS3/AS4 Profile of eSENS; or
  - ✓ AS2 data exchange protocol described in implementations of the "PEPPOL Transport Infrastructure AS2 Profile" or
  - ✓ both
- A Service Metadata Publisher (SMP) may be installed together with the access point:
  - ✓ This component is optional
  - ✓ PEPPOL's SMP Technical Specifications and OASIS' BDX-SMP Technical Specifications are covered
  - ✓ The installation of an SMP without an access point will not be funded

# eDelivery (Electronic delivery of documents): Eligibility

- Grants are to be offered to **consortia consisting of at least 5 entities** from one or more Member State(s)
