

Sea2Sea: Developing a multimodal freight corridor to connect the Aegean to the Black Sea

The overall objective of the Action is to explore the feasibility and viability of the "Sea2Sea corridor", linking by rail the ports of North-East Greece to the ports of the Black Sea and further on to the Danube, by examining alternative development/operational scenarios and proposing concrete actions for its realisation.

In order for this to be achieved, a number of sub-objectives are set, namely to:

- Analyse the current state and identify the future development of the Aegean and Black Sea region, the main freight corridors serving or crossing it and the "Sea2Sea corridor" in relation to them.
- Define a project mix and action plan for enhancing the "Sea2Sea corridor's" competitiveness.
- Define the major building blocks for the corridor's implementation, i.e. its funding, governance and needed preparatory actions.
- Achieve stakeholder engagement and public awareness, in relation to the corridor's implementation.
