ADD ME! is a pan-European network bringing together different social and institutional organisations that support or can support disadvantaged groups into a common framework and learning environment – by means of a community of practice - in becoming major beneficiaries of public services to which they are entitled. Three target groups are being addressed:

- a) **poor elderly and retired seniors;**
- b) **youngsters who are not part of any education, employment and training (NEET) activity, and non-EU teenagers who are in the process of integrating into a local community either with their families or by themselves;**
- c) **individual civil servants from small or medium size local governments, mainly those administrations that do not pertain to large metropolitan areas and suffer from the digital divide.**

The ADD ME! network consists of a number of organisations from 8 European countries interested in building a strong network to empower organisations working on a daily basis with disadvantaged groups in the use of government services which make use of information and communication technology.

The community of practice set up by the network is open to social and institutional intermediaries, such as the different levels of administrations, especially those acting locally (where nearly 70% of all eGovernment services are provided); NGOs, associations, labour unions and other social organisations and institutions supporting disadvantaged groups (such as foundations and charities); as well as by private institutions willing to support social inclusion programmes.

The strategy of the network is very flexible and multi-channelling, taking into account that intermediaries use and combine different ways to approach public and local services: from the more traditional channels such as face to face, telephone and mail to more innovative ICT-enabled services such as the internet, telekiosks, mobile phones and interactive television, etc.

Objectives

The ADD ME! project's vision can be summarised in the following objectives:

- a) bringing together the different aspects of Inclusive eGovernment by creating a community of practice on the web. Actual/potential social and institutional intermediaries to be engaged to support senior citizens and young people – including non-EU immigrants – as well as civil servants in making full use of public and local services enabled through ICT;
- b) creating awareness about the need for pro-active inclusive eGovernment policies at European, national and regional/local level, through a specific campaign, live events, focused meetings and a range of web services tailored to exchange experiences and knowledge between the members joining the network, as well as disseminating good practices and providing appropriate input and support to replicate successful initiatives;
- c) developing specific methodologies and tools to empower social and institutional intermediaries in vertical and horizontal subsidiary actions, gaining in impact, quality and sustainability of the different initiatives across Europe;
- d) acquiring international acceptance and worldwide leadership as a network promoting the use of public services ICT-supported by people and organisations in danger of exclusion through the intermediaries mentioned above.
