Panel session - Building Capacity to fight cybercrime and strengthen cybersecurity in the EU and beyond

The evolution of information communication technology, that brings so many benefits, has also led to the development of criminal activity that threatens citizens, businesses, governments and critical infrastructures alike: cybercrime. Governments, Law Enforcement Agencies and Society at large are faced with the challenge of ensuring sufficient and effective training and tools are developed to prevent and combat cybercrime.
