






Variety of instruments (share of EU funding)



Budget 2014-2020


Topics 2014-2020









EU funding (€) EU Member State




EU funding (€) per Associated country



Number of participations in grants for top 28 third countries (automatically eligible for funding or not)





- Proposals provide a detailed estimation of costs
- Experts assess cost details during evaluation and make recommendations
- Lump sum is fixed during grant preparation
- Same evaluation criteria
- Same pre-financing and payment scheme
- Reporting periods and technical reporting as today, though focusing on completion of work packages





- Fair and equal treatment of all proposals
- Based on criteria announced in the Work Programme
- Independent external experts
- Confidentiality and absence of conflict of interests



Evaluation criteria

Award criteria

- Excellence
- Impact
- Quality and efficiency of the implementation

Each criterion includes sub-criteria, which slightly differ depending on the type of Action



Scoring scale



Excellent. The proposal successfully addresses all relevant aspects of the criterion. Any shortcomings are minor.

Very Good. The proposal addresses the criterion very well, but a small number of shortcomings are present.

Good. The proposal addresses the criterion well, but a number of shortcomings are present.

Fair. The proposal broadly addresses the criterion, but there are significant weaknesses.

Poor. The criterion is inadequately addressed, or there are serious inherent weaknesses.

The proposal **fails** to address the criterion or cannot be assessed due to missing or incomplete information.

Exceptional funding (3rd country applicants/international organisations)

 Participants from +120 countries are automatically eligible for funding (list in general annex A of WP)



- International organisations & organisations from some 3rd countries (industrialised countries and emerging economies) are **not** automatically eligible for funding
- Evaluators assess if participation is essential
- If participation is NOT deemed essential, the participant will not receive EU funding.



Be prepared for a plan B! Be aware of that and already look for other sources of funds. If NO exceptional funding is granted, budget will be reduced but tasks should be carried out anyway.

Useful tips, resources and guidance for proposals preparation

Tips (1)

Read Carefully

- Funding and Tenders Portal (F&T): all the information is there!
- Work Programme (+ annexes), admissibility & eligibility conditions, topic description, conditions for the call.
- Check relevant projects already funded (<u>CORDIS</u>)
- Contact your National Contact Point for guidance / assistance

Test your idea

- Define how proposal objectives can be linked to the topic objectives;
- Partner search feature



Tips (2)

Proposal building

- **Start in time**! You shall start preparing the proposal before the opening date (i.e. 15/10/2019)
- **Excellent science** is not enough. Consider carefully all evaluation (sub-)criteria
- Be **coherent.** There must be a match between objectives, expected impacts, planned activities, partners skills/expertises and the assigned resources.
- Plan your **budget** carefully, with a bottom-up approach. For instance, include costs for project review meetings, open access publishing costs, open research data and clustering with other projects (if required by the Work Programme).
- Write clearly and concisely. Less is more!
- Respect the **page limits.** Excess pages will be blanked out. Instructions available in proposal templates. Information deliberately integrated in the support annexes will not be taken into account.

Tips (3)

Coordinate

- Choose your **partners** carefully (e.g. brokerage events, F&T `partner search' section); clarify their **roles** (e.g. beneficiaries vs. third parties)
- Ensure a valid role for each partner and assign resources accordingly
- Think about the administrative set up at proposal stage

Final considerations

- Ask someone impartial to proof-read your proposal (self-evaluation form available)
- Put yourself in the shoes of an expert evaluator
- Avoid last minute submission. Submit drafts (overwriting)



Communication, Dissemination, Exploitation

Communication	Dissemination	Exploitation
Promote the project and results / success	Focus on results only	Make concrete use of research results
Reach out to society , show the impact and benefits of EU-funded research.	Transfer knowledge and results to enable others to use them.	Effective use of results to deliver concrete value and impact for society.
Multiple audiences beyond the project's own community incl. media and the broad public.	Audiences that <i>may</i> use the results (e.g. scientific community, industrial partner, policymakers).	People / organisations incl. project partners that make concrete use of the results.
Since the start of the project	When results are available	When results are available
Art. 38.1	Art. 29	Art. 28

Admissibility: full proposals must include a draft plan for the exploitation and dissemination of the results. Guidance on <u>H2020 Online Manual</u>



European Commission Open access: on-line access to scientific information free of charge and in reusable format

Peer-reviewed scientific publications

Mandatory

Research data

Default opt-in (possible opt-out) As open as possible, as closed as necessary

 Plan at proposal stage the resources required to manage open access to scientific publications and/or research data

- Applicants fill in the Ethics Self-Assessment when preparing a full proposal
 - Ethics Issues Table in Part A (<u>How to complete your ethics self-assessment</u> guide.)
 - Ethics section (5.1) in Part B
- Each proposal considered for funding is subject to an ethics review by ethics experts prior to the signature of the Grant Agreement
- If information is missing or incomplete on ethics issues' handling, it will slow down the grant preparation and additional ethics requirements may have to be fulfilled before the research activity can start.





Common shortcomings/weaknesses

Excellence

- Objectives not fully pertinent to the call
- Proposal not ambitious enough and/or not going beyond the state of the art
- Requirements not fully addressed (i.e Multi-Actor Approach)

Impact

- Proposal not convincingly demonstrating its contribution to all expected impacts
- Communication, exploitation and dissemination are mixed up


Implementation

- Work packages not in line with objectives and deliverables
- Work plan not sufficiently detailed and resources not justified
