Transposition and Infringements

It is to be noted that the Single Market *acquis* applicable in EEA EFTA States does not coincide exactly with that applicable in EU Member States. This situation arises from the time lag between the adoption or abrogation of legal acts by the EU and their incorporation into or deletion from the EEA Agreement.

Any comparison of the results from the two different Scoreboards (this one and the EEA EFTA Scoreboard) has to take this difference into account. For more information on Iceland's performance, please see the EFTA Surveillance Authority's Internal Market Scoreboard.



Transposition deficit: 1.8% (*last report: 2.1%*) – Better, but still far above the 1% target. Highest deficit of the EEA States

EEA/EFTA average: 1.0%


Overdue directives: 16 (*last report: 21*) and **2** more than 2 years overdue.

Average delay: 18 months (*last report: 23.4 months*) – decrease of 5.4 months because Iceland has reduced the number of overdue directives by 5 since the previous report. The figure is still high, however. This is because 2 directives have been overdue for over 2 years, one of which has been overdue for over 8 years.

EFTA average: 13.3 months

Compliance deficit: 0.1% (last report: 0.3%)

Pending cases: 21 (*last report: 22*)

Problematic sectors:

- goods technical barriers (4)
- food and feed safety, animal health and welfare (4)
- transport (4)


Average case duration: 16.2 months (*last report: 12.8 months*)

Compliance with court rulings: 13 months (*last report: 13 months*) – no new cases at this stage of the procedure.

Internal Market Information System

Performance – Iceland's performance remains poor.

- Iceland's performance is well below the EU average for all 5 indicators.
- In 2014, Iceland did not respond to any requests. However, in 2015 it processed most incoming requests.
- Significant efforts should be made to improve all indicators.

Make an effort to:


- provide all missing information on how Iceland applies single market rules
