

About

The Your Europe portal seeks to help people and companies move and/or do business in the EU by providing clear information on their single market rights and signposting them to assistance services when needed.

Putting user needs first, the multilingual portal has 2 separate sections:

- Citizens and
- Business.

Its content is provided by both **EU** institutions and national governments.

EU governments can support this website in 2 important ways:


- by **contributing content** to it (i.e. national rules implementing the single market)
- by **promoting it** to their own citizens and businesses.

The 2013 Commission Action Plan for Your Europe reiterated the need for EU countries to provide support. The Competitiveness Council and the European Parliament endorsed this.



A country's **overall performance** is calculated by assigning the following values to each of its 3 individual indicators:

- red = 0,
- yellow = 1
- green = 2.

The average is calculated and the appropriate colour assigned.


2. overall (all 3 indicators combined)


Improved content on a number of pages including

- Selling abroad (distance selling, unfair contract terms, late payment, importing/exporting goods)


Facts and Figures

- Automatic exchange of content (syndication) with 2 national portals (Malta, Croatia)
- Use of the site is **still growing fast** over one million monthly visits in this period (800 000 in the previous period)
- Continued **high level of satisfaction** more than 90% 'satisfied' or 'very satisfied' in online surveys
