The United Kingdom withdrew from the EU on 31 January, 2020. The 2020 edition of the Single Market Scoreboard refers to time periods preceding the withdrawal of the UK, and the UK is therefore listed as a Member State.

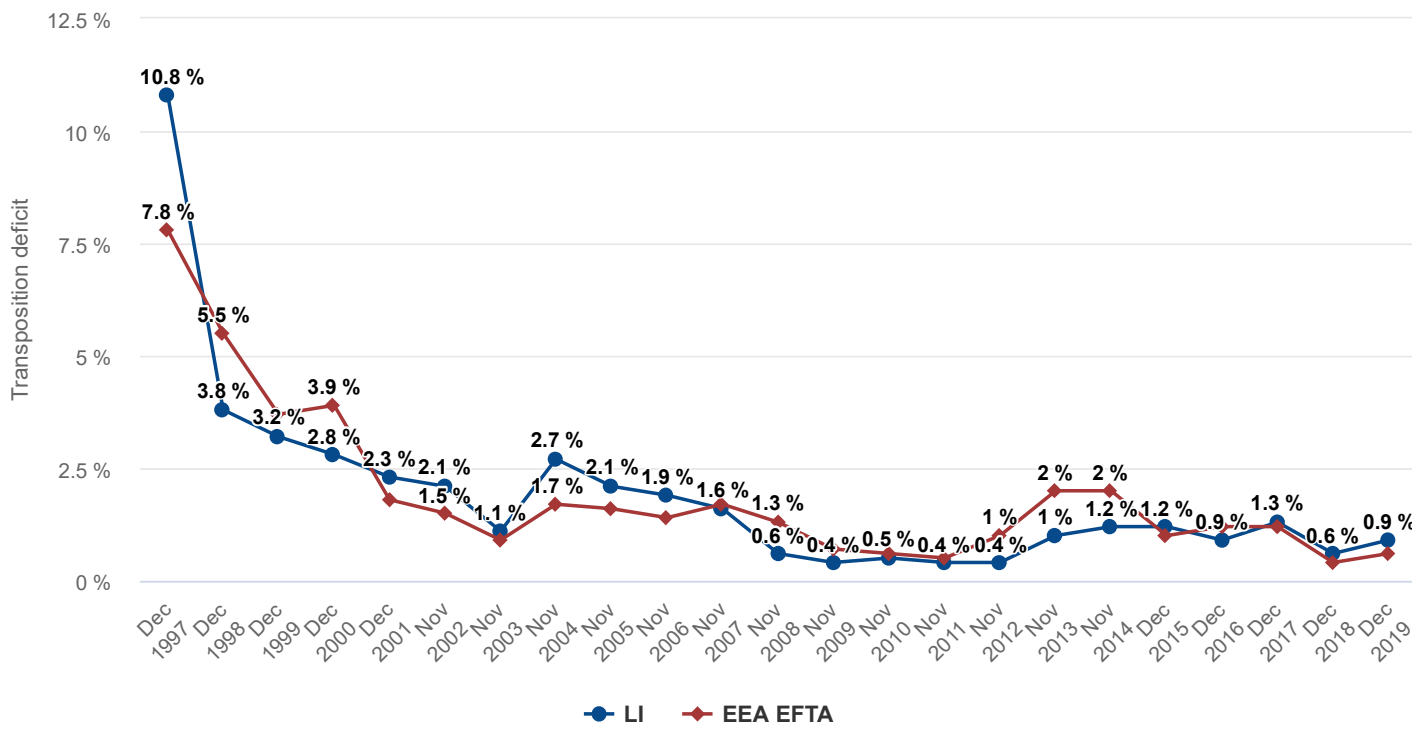

Transposition and Infringements

It is to be noted that the Single Market *acquis* applicable in EEA EFTA States does not coincide exactly with that applicable in EU Member States. This situation arises from the time lag between the adoption or abrogation of legal acts by the EU and their incorporation into or deletion from the EEA Agreement.

Evolution of transposition deficit – Liechtenstein



Transposition deficit: 0.9 % (last report: 0.6 %) – increase by 0.3 percentage point since December 2018.

EEA EFTA average: 0.6 %

Overdue directives: 7 (last report: 5) with 5 being more than 2 years overdue.

Average delay: 52.5 months (last report: 57.7 months) – slight decrease by 5.2 months since December 2018.

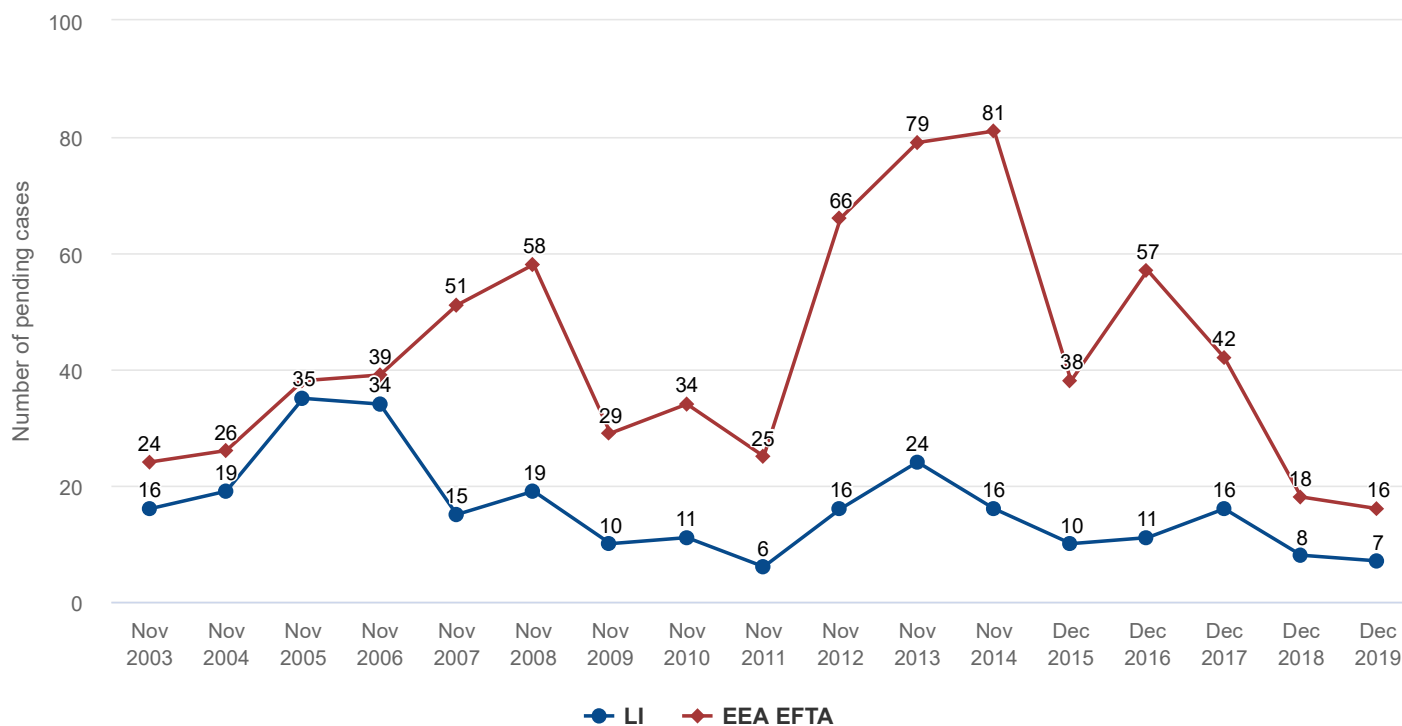
EEA EFTA average: 28 months

This decrease reflects the fact that Liechtenstein now has 5 directives that are overdue by 2 years or more as well as 2 directives that are overdue by 6–12 months.

Conformity deficit: 0.1 % (last report: 0.1 %) – stable result.

Internal Market Information System

Performance – Liechtenstein performed very well, handling just one request in 2019.

- Liechtenstein dealt with just 1 request, which was handled in a timely manner.
- It performed above the EEA average in 5 indicators.
- Counterparts responding to the survey expressed 100% satisfaction.

EURES

National provider: Liechtenstein is a member of the EURES network but is not connected to the job vacancy exchange with EURES.

Vacancies in Liechtenstein on the EURES portal are being made available by public employment (PES) in neighbouring countries.

Compliance: Not compliant

Performance: data on JVs and CVs should be transferred to the EURES portal.

Your Europe

The EU has set up a **single digital gateway** providing access to information, to procedures and to assistance and problem-solving services.

The specific regulation setting up the single digital pathway is Regulation 2018/1724 of 2 October 2018. Article 29 of the Regulation establishes a group to coordinate work on the gateway. The gateway coordination group will meet in different configurations, with one devoted to information that meets twice a year. The other two configurations are dedicated to ICT and e-procedures and assistance services.

The information group continues the work of the former Your Europe Editorial Board. This is to ensure that the gateway coordination group's work does not overlap with that of other expert groups or sub-groups.

Record for this period

- no participation in the single digital gateway information group
- responsive to most of the requests for information to be published on the website
- back-linking from national websites to Your Europe; no promotional activities reported

Recommended action

Continue to:

- ensure stable representation on the single digital gateway information group
- attend the single digital gateway information group meetings twice a year
- provide information on how the country applies single market rules, in line with the requirements of the single digital gateway Regulation
- link national websites to Your Europe

Make an effort to:

- raise awareness about Your Europe with the national administration and among potential end users

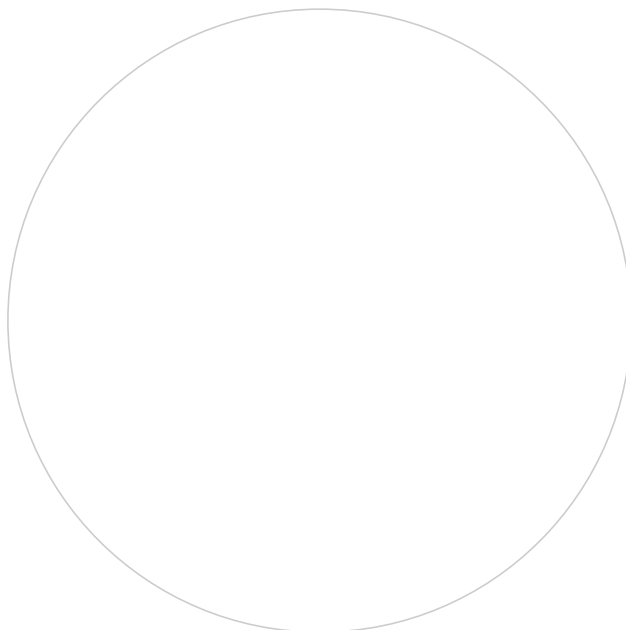
