14 out of 29 legislative proposals agreed so far:
 Connectivity: 700 MHz, wholesale roaming, Wi-Fi EU
 e-Commerce: Consumer protection, cooperation, geoblocking, VAT e-commerce, cross-border parcel delivery
 Media/copyright: Portability of on-line content, Marrakesh Treaty, audiovisual media services directive (preliminary political agreement)
 e-Gov: Single Digital Gateway
 Trust: Data protection rules for EU institutions

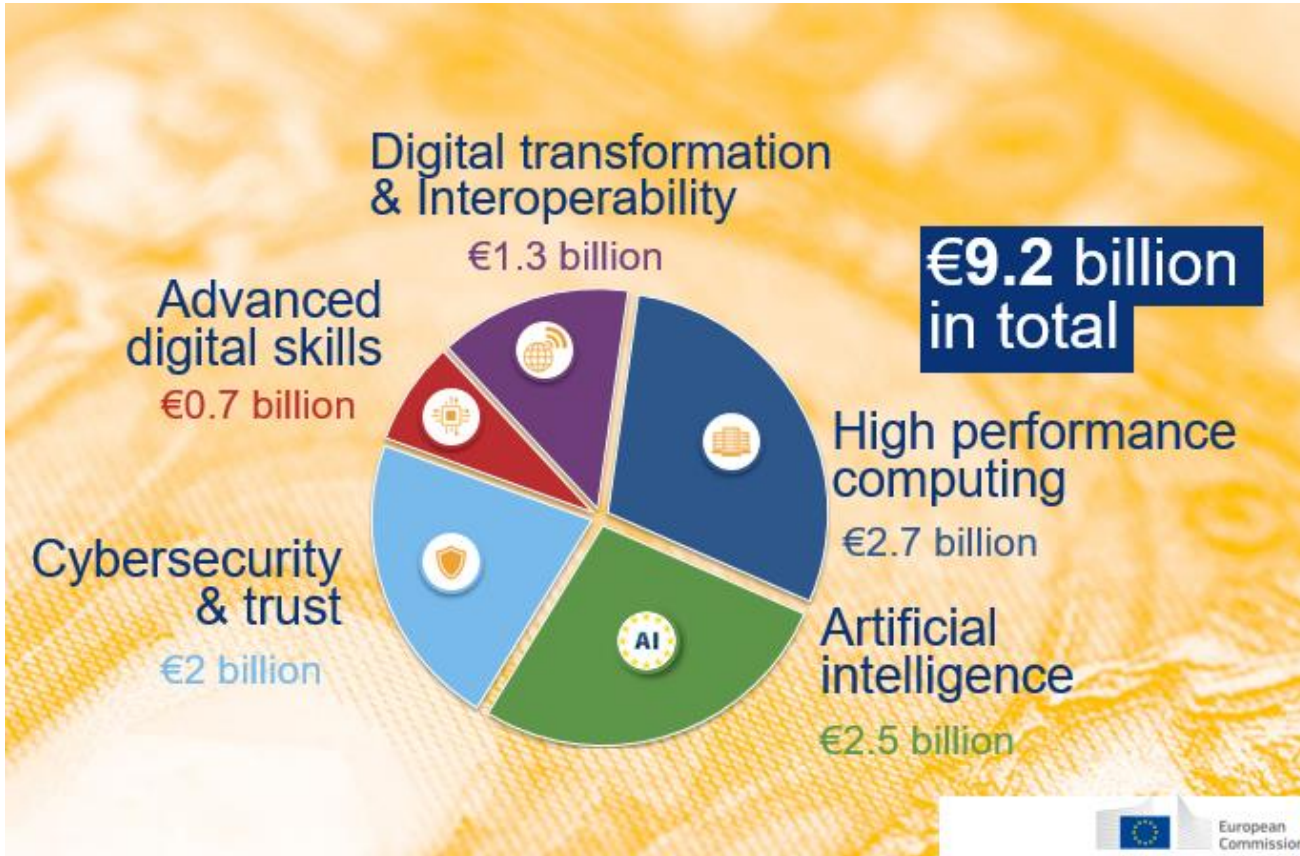

Pres. Paper “Rethinking European Industry”

- We need a **strong presence of technical and practical skills** in educational programs/curricula.
- Digitalization is an **instrument** as well as a **future-oriented learning tool** but also part of **new occupational profiles and professions**.
- **The Commission’s New Skills Agenda** is a step in the right direction and contributes to better transparency.
- **Lifelong Learning** is an instrument to make sure that digitalization reaches out to the citizens, making them aware of chances and risks from early childhood on.
- **Increased awareness of the gender gap** in the European digital sector with even more notable initiatives, at both **local and national levels**.
