- The NIFO Community on Joinup currently offers 31 factsheets summarising the interoperability activities and the NIF/EIF alignment in each country (if applicable).
- 32 e-Government factsheets, summing up the state of e-Government for the EC Member States and Associated countries
- The NIF analytical models of 24 countries are currently online, providing an insight into each country's approach to interoperability, in line with the EIF.
- A comparison of these analytical models can be performed through the NIFO community on Joinup.
- Upon request, ISA can provide advice on drafting a National Interoperability Framework.
- The NIFO maintenance process provides updates per country on a continuous basis.

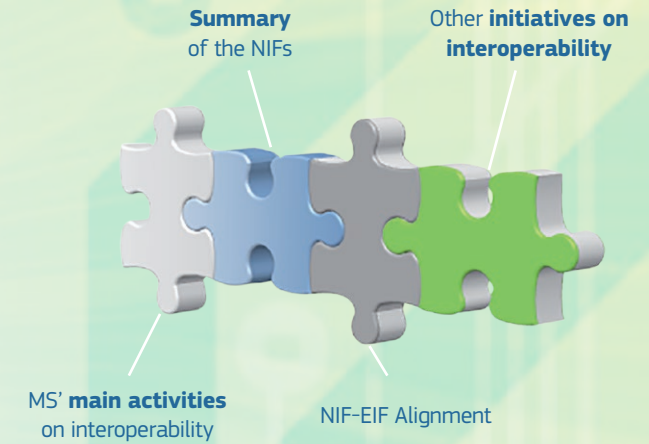
About NIFO

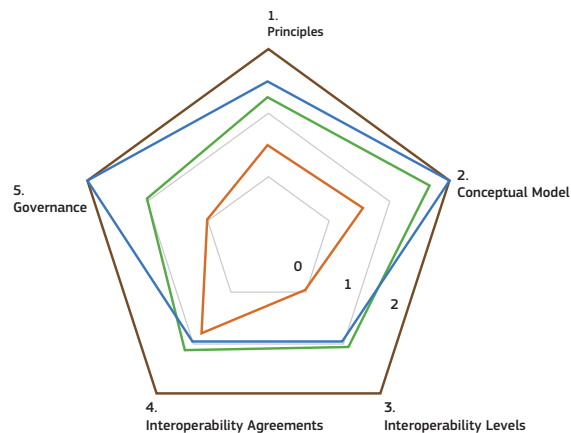
