PROTECTION OF YOUR PERSONAL DATA

This privacy statement provides information about the processing and the protection of your personal data.

Processing operation: Access to subscriptions and to e-resources

Data Controller: Publications Office, Unit OP.A.4 "Library and Preservation Services"

Record reference: DPR-EC-03729

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1. Introduction

The European Commission (hereafter 'the Commission') is committed to protect your personal data and to respect your privacy. The Commission collects and further processes personal data pursuant to Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2018 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data (repealing Regulation (EC) No 45/2001).

This privacy statement explains the reason for the processing of your personal data, the way we collect, handle and ensure protection of all personal data provided, how that information is used and what rights you have in relation to your personal data. It also specifies the contact details of the responsible Data Controller with whom you may exercise your rights, the Data Protection Officer and the European Data Protection Supervisor.

The information in relation to processing operation "Access to subscriptions and to e-resources" undertaken by Unit OP.A.4, "Library and Preservation Services" of the Publications Office, is presented below.

Set up in 1958, the EC Library, a central service for all Commission staff, is part of the Publications Office of the European Union (Publications Office). Since the library's inception, its mission has remained largely unchanged: to help Commission staff obtain high-quality information on a given subject as quickly and effectively as possible.

2. Why and how do we process your personal data?

<u>Purpose of the processing operation</u>: OP.A.4 may collect and use your personal information in order to provide a variety of Library services which you have requested or are using. We may use your personal data in order to give you access to electronic resources (such as electronic journals, e-books, articles and databases) and to ensure that our electronic subscriptions are properly managed. Your data are not further processed in a way incompatible with the purpose for which they are collected.

Your personal data may be processed when you use the EC Library services to access electronic resources, which include the websites of information services providers and web portals of publishers/content providers.

Your personal data will not be used for an automated decision-making including profiling.

3. On what legal ground(s) do we process your personal data

We process your personal data under Article 5.1 of the Regulation:

5(1)(a) processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Union institution or body;

5(1)(b) processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation to which the controller is subject;

Additional legal basis:

Decision 2009/496/EC, Euratom of the European Parliament, the Council, the Commission, the Court of Justice, the Court of Auditors, the European Economic and Social Committee and the Committee of the Regions of 26 June 2009 on the organisation and operation of the Publications Office of the European Union, Art. 3(1)(h).

4. Which personal data do we collect and further process?

In order to carry out this processing operation OP.A.4 collects the following categories of personal data:

• General Information: First name, Last name

Contact Information: Email address

• Account login credentials

Usage data

Where possible, we collect and use details which do not identify you as a named individual, such as website usage information, aggregated information and statistics, and other details of how you use our electronic resources.

5. How long do we keep your personal data?

OP.A.4 only keeps your personal data for the time necessary to fulfil the purpose of collection or further processing. In general and where not related to a specific service, we will retain your personal information for maximum 24 months from the expiration/termination of the access to the library services.

6. How do we protect and safeguard your personal data?

All personal data in electronic format (e-mails, documents, databases, uploaded batches of data, etc.) are stored either on the servers of the European Commission or of its contractors. All processing operations are carried out pursuant to the Commission Decision (EU, Euratom) 2017/46 of 10 January 2017 on the security of communication and information systems in the European Commission.

The Commission's contractors are bound by a specific contractual clause for any processing operations of your data on behalf of the Commission, and by the confidentiality obligations deriving from the transposition of the General Data Protection Regulation in the EU Member States ('GDPR' Regulation (EU) 2016/679).

In order to protect your personal data, the Commission has put in place a number of technical and organisational measures in place. Technical measures include appropriate actions to address online security, risk of data loss, alteration of data or unauthorised access, taking into consideration the risk presented by the processing and the nature of the personal data being processed. Organisational measures include restricting access to the personal data solely to authorised persons with a legitimate need to know for the purposes of this processing operation.

7. Who has access to your personal data and to whom is it disclosed?

Access to your personal data is provided to the Commission staff responsible for carrying out this processing operation and to authorised staff according to the "need to know" principle. Such staff abide by statutory, and when required, additional confidentiality agreements.

In addition, the EC Library makes use of external contractors to provide services on our behalf such as access to electronic resources. These third party service providers ("Data Processors") may use your personal information in order to assist the Library, or to provide the agreed service to you on our behalf. All of our contractors are bound by strict contractual terms in order to ensure that your personal information will be protected appropriately.

8. What are your rights and how can you exercise them?

You have specific rights as a 'data subject' under Chapter III (Articles 14-25) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, in particular the right to access, your personal data and to rectify them in case your personal data are inaccurate or incomplete. Where applicable, you have the right to erase your personal data, to restrict the processing of your personal data, to object to the processing, and the right to data portability.

You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data, which is lawfully carried out pursuant to Article 5(1)(a) on grounds relating to your particular situation.

You can exercise your rights by contacting the Data Controller, or in case of conflict the Data Protection Officer. If necessary, you can also address the European Data Protection Supervisor. Their contact information is given under Heading 9 below.
