# EU Trust Fund for Africa

## Support to Libya

Through the Emergency Trust Fund for Africa the European Union is actively working to provide protection, assistance and alternatives to migrants, refugees and internally displaced people in Libya. Help is being provided for migrants at disembarkation points, inside and outside detention centres or in host communities by IOM and UNHCR. Help provided includes for example medical assistance, or the distribution of basic items and hygiene kits. Support is also aimed at stabilisation of host communities, through socio-economic development at municipal level and to better integrate migrants, internally displaced people and returnees. All projects are implemented by international partners on the ground, such as the UN agencies or by EU member states.

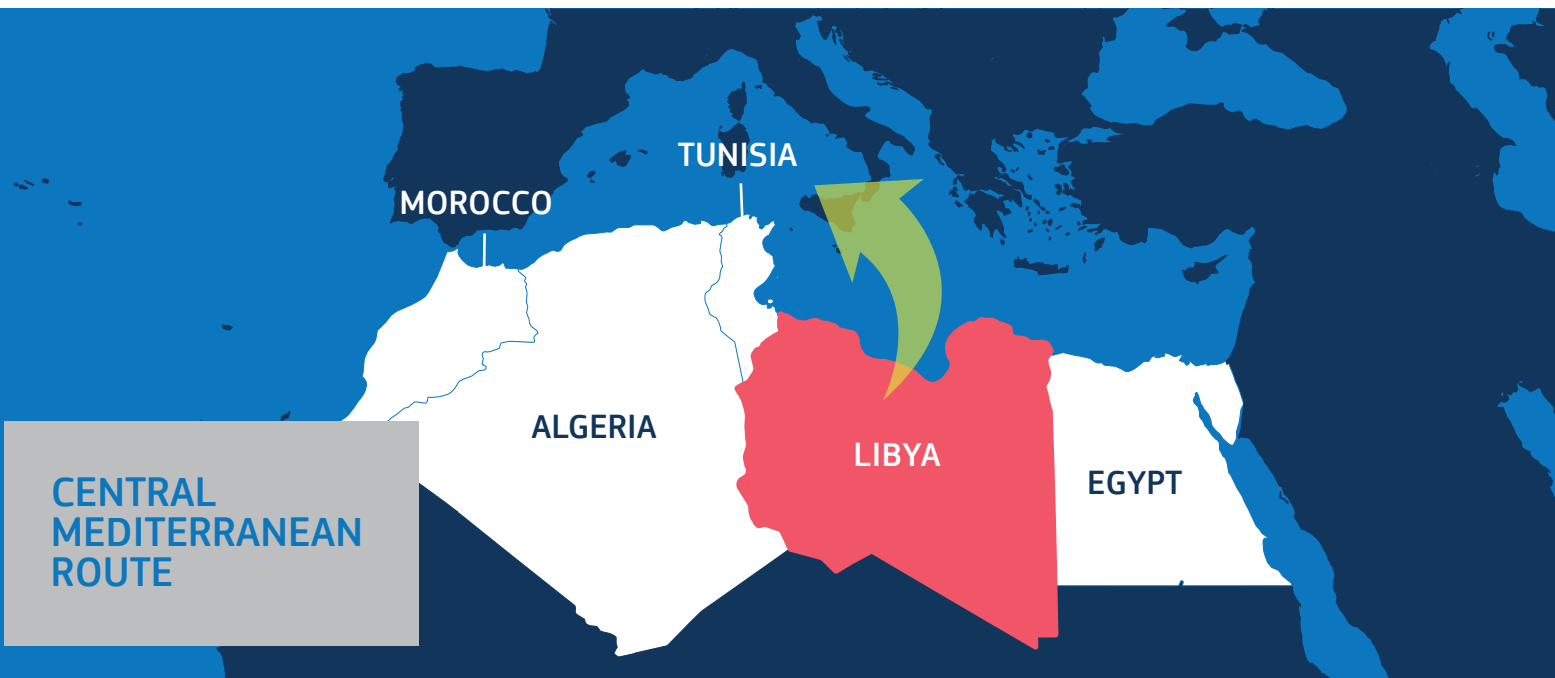

### RESULTS SO FAR

**22,000**

migrants have benefitted from Voluntary Humanitarian Return and Reintegration assistance with a significant contribution from the EU Trust Fund for Africa in 2017 and 2018\*

**33,000**

migrants have received direct assistance (non-food items and hygiene kits)

**3,500**

Libyan families have received basic support

Primary Health Care Centers have received medical equipment with a capacity to serve 35,500 persons

### PROTECTION AND ASSISTANCE TO THOSE IN NEED

- ✓ Provide assistance and protection services to stranded migrants both at disembarkation points, in detention centres and in urban areas
- ✓ Offer voluntary humanitarian return (VHR) assistance to stranded migrants from Libya to their countries of origin, including reintegration support
- ✓ Support the evacuation of asylum seekers and refugees from Libya and access to solutions to persons of concern to UNHCR in Libya in the framework of the Evacuation Transit Mechanism (ETM)
- ✓ Training on human rights and international standards for Libyan authorities (DCIM, Libyan Coast Guard and Port Security personnel)
- ✓ Establish mixed community development centres and safe spaces in alternative to detention centres
- ✓ Set up a Protection Fund to cover needs of migrants in detention centres and in communities

### STABILISATION OF LIBYAN MUNICIPALITIES

- ✓ Rehabilitate schools, hospitals, nurseries and police stations
- ✓ Repair and build water and sanitation infrastructure
- ✓ Train teachers and provide access to formal and non-formal education
- ✓ Training and capacity building for service providers and relevant local stakeholders in management of social infrastructure and provision of basic and social services to vulnerable people (including migrants, refugees, IDPs, returnees and host communities)
- ✓ Provision of equipment for essential service delivery and direct provision of quality basic and social services in coordination with Libyan central authorities

### INTEGRATED BORDER MANAGEMENT

**€46.3M** SUPPORT TO INTEGRATED BORDER AND MIGRATION MANAGEMENT  
Adopted in July 2017

- ✓ Support both Libyan coast guards (under the Ministry of Interior and under the Ministry of Defence) in the form of training, including on human rights, and equipment (i.e. repair of existing vessels, supply of communication and rescue equipment, rubber boats and vehicles)
- ✓ Set up basic operational rooms for the Coast Guards in Tripoli
- ✓ Undertake pilot activities to increase capacity for southern border surveillance in the area of Ghât, after an assessment of the situation
