After the Libyan Uprising in 2011, the EU rapidly responded to help the Libyan people in close cooperation with the United Nations Support Mission for Libya (UNSMIL). EU-Policy towards Libya aims at assisting the country in its efforts to establish a democratic, stable and prosperous state. This involves promoting democratic transition, based on an inclusive contribution, the emergence of strong, transparent and accountable institutions, an alert civil society and a vibrant private sector. Besides, the European Union is actively working to provide protection, assistance and alternatives to migrants, refugees and internally displaced people in Libya.

## EU ENGAGEMENT WITH LIBYA



- Cooperation in the field of protection and migration through the EU Emergency Trust Fund for Africa in Libya between 2015 and 2018 reached nearly € 380 million;
- Trade: €3.64 million in import from the EU/€11.60 million in export to the EU;
- Libya benefits from EU thematic programmes and instruments such as ERASMUS+, the European Instrument for Democracy and Human Rights (EIDHR), the Civil Society Organisations and Local Authorities (CSO/LA) programme and the Development Cooperation Instrument (DCI).
