

Digital Skills and Jobs Coalition


ESTONIA

The Estonian National Coalition pursues to bridge the digital skills gap by focusing on programmes that can train large portions of the population in digital skills. The coalition includes policy makers, e-service providers and IT-training companies. It has developed self-funded and large-scale training initiatives that aim to lessen the digital skills gap. The purpose of these activities is to lower the number of people in Estonia that do not use computers or the Internet to 5%.

Main achievements and projects

- E-citizens project: a total of 5000 people will be trained in basic computer skills from 2018 to 2021.
- Industry DigiABC: a project that provides digital skills training for the members of the industrial sector in 2017 to 2020.
- SmartAcademy provides trainings for people that use smart devices, such as tablets or smart phones. The project aims to introduce secure digital authentication solutions such as Mobile-ID and Smart-ID to users, so they could use e-services more conveniently and, most importantly, safely.
