CEMR= network organisation since 1951, of NATIONAL associations of LRGS -> 60 from 40 countries; or members represent all levels (so intermediate and regional as well) and ¾ of associations represent local level only . Publication on CEMR and the national associations in Europe: https://www.ccre.org/img/uploads/piecesjointe/filename/CEMR study association local government EN.pdf We represent their voice at European level, from an advocacy point of view, to make sure that whatever is done takes also local and regional level into account, but also from the knowledge point of view, sharing practices, experiences, and data.

As such, we cooperate a lot with the JRC, whether it is on urban issues, SDGs, following the work of networks like the City Science Initiative, and cooperating on reports and toolkits like the Handbook of sustainable urban development strategies or the one on SDG Voluntary Local Reviews... To deepen our collaboration, we even signed a MoU with the JRC to coordinate, mutualise and find synergies in our work on common issues.

All our work is obviously linked to LRGs but to name just one recent project, the new CEMR-URBACT pilot network of cities localising Sustainable Development Goals needs to be mentioned (https://urbact.eu/sdg-network). The "Global Goals 4 Cities" network (as the 19 cities participating have named it themselves: https://www.ccre.org/fr/actualites/view/4177) aims for capacity-building of territories to have an integrated and sustainable approach of their public policies and services.

I also need to emphasize some of our publications (I'll paste some links in the chat) but allow me to only cite our annual series on SDGs localisation in Europe: https://www.ccre.org/img/uploads/piecesjointe/filename/CEMR PLATFORMA SDGs EN.pdf

We are now working on this year edition with a special focus on Voluntary Local as well as Subnational reviews, as well as COVID-19 recovery actions, and we intend to present it to the HLPF.

To finish, Id' like to insist just on one more "political point" maybe, or recommendation for the work of the CoP... My job, the whole point of my job actually, is to make sure research and data is useful <u>and</u> used by policy and decision makers... It is a real challenge and, in this context, CEMR teams do look a lot in the tools, methods, and networks that are now displayed in the JRC URBAN OBSERVATORY ON THE FUTURE OF CITIES AND URBAN STRATEGIES; but I'd like to insist on the importance of small and medium cities that should be given more attention.

Also, as Mr Landabaso emphasized, we all work for making sure the cities have the place they deserve = but what about rural areas? Especially in terms of recovery, of "new normal" = what kind of urbanisation and place for cities are we thinking of, what about ruralisation?
