Video tutorials for resources of training the mindSET

Training the mindSET – Improving and Internationalizing Skills Trainings for Doctoral Candidates



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I. Background

The original plan was to develop three webinars which were to be recorded during learning, teaching, training activities for doctoral candidates. These were to be made available as self-learning courses. However, due to the outbreak of SARS-CoV2 in 2020, the original plan was dropped. Instead, the project team decided upon creating video tutorials that help removing obstacles with regards to implementing the contents developed in the project at other higher education institutions.

The tutorials give advice on how to use the different resources the project team released. They address different target groups and explain the benefits the manuals and tools offer. In addition, the tutorials present footage of the actual use of the resources and deliver instructions for users while also briefly embedding the contents produced into a theoretical framework.

II. Video tutorials

In total, three tutorials have been produced, each addressing another intellectual output.

The videos have been released on two platforms. First, they are accessible at http://www.mindset-project.eu/results/webinars/, accompanying the other results and introducing the topic assigned and providing tips on how to use and implement the presented resource. The videos also serve as teasers for the other outputs and as a means to gain attraction from higher education institutions.

Second, each video has been uploaded to YouTube individually, aiming at further disseminating the intellectual outputs to stakeholders outside universities (see links above).

The first tutorial was produced by Dr. Björn Kiehne, an expert in didactics in adult education, and has a duration of almost six minutes. The second video was designed by the project team and contains a voice-over of an American native speaker. In nearly eight minutes, the contents of the coaching manual are presented. The third tutorial on the competence assessment tools was designed at TU Berlin and features footage of the downloadable tools for competence (self-)assessment and Dr. Simone Bartsch as presenter. It has a length of roughly eight minutes.
