



STRENGTHENING OF GOOD GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATIVE CAPACITY FOR COHESION POLICY - PILOT ACTION IN COOPERATION WITH THE OECD -

THE BACKGROUND

Quality institutions and well-functioning administrations matter for the effectiveness and impact of EU function in the Member States and regions. Focusing on EU Cohesion Policy funding, the VII Cohesion Report and recent research from academia and the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (DECD) have shown that regions with weak institutions frace greater difficulties effectively absorbing regional development and cohesion function making the most of the Investments that these funds support. The quality of governance at all levels of government influences how cohesion investment translates into greater growth. In addition, quality institutions (and through these institutional practices) can positively affect the returns to Cohesion Policy Investment, regional competitiveness and economic growth, whereas poor institutions will have an adverse effect. Thus, it is essential to Invest the governance, to build adequate capabilities at all levels of government to manage EU (mode, and to design strong Investment strategies.

THE PILOT PROJECT

The pilot action "Frontloading administrative capacity building to prepare for the 2021-2027 programming period" was launched in June 2018 to provide hands-on support by experts from the Commission and the DECD to strengthen the administrative capacity of the authorities dealing with EU funds on a daily basis. The goal is to test and develop new solutions to strengthen administrative capacity in the post 2020 budgetary period.

Phase I

Identification of strengths and specific weaknesses to address through a participatory process, involving all relevant actors.
Preparation of roadmaps to address the weaknesses with milestones, targets and deadlines.

Phase II Finglementation of key relevant actions from the roadmaps.

- The "Transport infrastructure, environment and sustainable development" programme in Greece
- The Lubelskie regional programme in Poland
- The Extremadura regional programme in Spain
- The "Competitiveness and cohesion" programme in Croatia



Available in 22 languages



Integrity Pacts – Civil Control Mechanism for Safeguarding EU Funds

Since 2015, **18** pilot projects in **11** Member States covering 8 sectors: *Transport, Institutional Building & Administrative Capacity, Environment, Culture, Integrated Territorial Investment, Monitoring, Education, Healthcare*

An Integrity pact is an agreement bringing together contracting authorities, economic operators and an independent monitor (civil society organisation) to ensure that major public contracts are procured and implemented to the highest possible standards of transparency, accountability and efficiency, according to the public interest

Integrity Pacts: Acknowledged benefits

Selection of MAs/IBs to be concluded soon



Citizens' engagement: support for civil society organisations' projects

Grants for projects led by civil society organisations to develop new tools or actions that support citizens' engagement in cohesion policy.

Proposals are currently under evaluation. **15 Projects** will be selected to receive financial support (up to **EUR 25.000**). The duration of each project will be maximum 12 months.

Results of selection process are expected to be announced in **September 2020**.



Anti-fraud capacity-building toolbox

- A central website acting as an elearning platform and toolbox on anti-fraud and corruption
- Providing case studies, good practices and diagnostic tools to support practitioners in MS in their work to prevent and detect fraud and corruption in ESIF projects
- Expected to be ready in the first half of 2021
