Cohesion open data: what is it?

Since 2015 unique data on EU budget programmes based on the content of 1) adopted programmes and 2) monitoring of finances and achievements (common indicators).

3 levels available to explore:

- Website with curated visualisations by country / fund / theme
- Data stories: exploring the data in more detail with narrative and explanatory texts
- Open data: Download, visualise, build analysis with API formatted datasets

For DG REGIO ODP complements Inforegio website and Kohesio project database



Key changes

Evolution not revolution

- ESIF Cohesion Open Data Platform
- New navigation menu: 2014-2020 ⇔ 2021-2027
- New navigation pages for 2021-2027 funds, countries with different look
- More shared management funds covered: JTF + DG Home Funds
- Planned extension to cover entirety of CAP plans (2023)
- New datasets with different data structure vs 2014-2020

- Fund pages with new Funds for 2021-2027 showing adopted programmes.
 EU funding volume will increase day by day until early 2023




1. Introduction


A Partnership Agreement is a strategic document where a Member State describes the longterm strategy of the use of the cohesion policy funds - the European Regional development Fund (ERDF), the European Social Fund Plus (ESF+), the Cohesion Fund (CF), the Just Transition Fund (JTF) - and the European Maritime and the Fisheries and Aquaculture Fund (EMFAF). The Partnership Agreement includes the objectives that the Member State intends to












Finances planned charts




Finances planned: detailed

Cohesion policy uses a categorisation system to provide detailed thematic information on the finances planned. The detail captured is linked to the high level "policy objectives" and presented below in aggregated for the ERDF, ESF+, Cohesion Fund and JTF in an interactive sankey chart.


Click on the chart elements or use the drop down menus to filter by countries, funds, themes, etc. Users can also hold crtl and click selection to select multiple elements. Press "reset selection" in case of non response.


2021-2027: Cohesion Policy Planned EU financing by detailed themes (categorisation)






