





#### Progress with mainstream CP programmes
















#### 2. CPR novelties

Kadri UUSTAL Head of Unit – Coordination of programmes **DG for Regional and Urban Policy** 



- Five policy objectives
- **Single rulebook:** A single rulebook for eight shared management funds, including the JTF and the HOME Funds for the first time
- Reduction of secondary legislation: Significant reduction in the amount of secondary legislation (common templates for all funds available immediately upon the adoption of the CPR as annexes)
- Synergies: Efficient synergies with other EU instruments, such as Horizon Europe or Invest-EU
- Lighter controls: Lighter controls for programmes, through proportionate arrangements for audits in the event of a good track record, limiting the audits; extension of the "single audit" principle, to avoid duplication of checks
- Verifications: Reduction of management verifications based on risk assessment



• Greater empowerment of local, urban and territorial authorities in the management of the EU funds (PO5) implemented via 3 types of instruments:



- More frequent (5 times a year), but lighter and real time reporting for cohesion policy instead of annual reporting; results will be shown directly on <u>Open Data Platform</u>
- Development of financing not linked to costs among new methods of reimbursing
- Technical assistance can be supported only on the basis of flat rates, upon the decision of each Member State



- Reinforced **thematic concentration**, around 5 policy objectives, focusing on green, digital and just transition as well more inclusive and social Europe
- More **strategic programming** (e.g. mid-term review determining if changes in the programmes are needed, with a "flexibility amount" of funding available in each programme for possible reprogramming and reprioritising)
- More **flexibilities** in transferring resources
- Fulfilment of **enabling conditions** required throughout the programming period
- Provisions on **partnership** strengthened
- **De-commitment** in n+3 but last year is 2029 (n+2)



- Lower (5% instead of 10%) retention rate on payments
- Obligation to collect information on beneficial owners of beneficiaries, of final recipients of financial instruments and of contractors in public procurement through a single data mining tool allowing for better comparability of data and risk assessment
- Management costs and fees for **financial instruments** that are directly awarded outside public procurement at the differentiated levels and higher than Commission's proposal





#### ESF+ Thematic concentration – legal requirements

ESF+ thematic concentration minimum requirements (Art. 7 and Art. 9 ESF+ Regulation) :

- Addressing **CSR** (appropriate amount MS concerned)
- Social Inclusion (25% all MS)
- Material deprivation (3% all MS)
- Youth employment, education and training (12,5% BG, HR, CY, FR, GR, IT, RO, SK, ES)
- Child poverty tackling (5% BG, HR, CY, GR, HU, IE, IT, LT, LU, RO, ES)
- Capacity building of social partners & civil society organisations (0,25% HU, PL, RO)

### 6. HOME Funds – final steps of programming

### State of play in programming

- All Member States' programmes expected to be adopted by the end of 2022;
- In addition to Member States' programmes the Thematic Facility is part of the HOME funds and complementary to MS programmes focusing on actions of high EU added value, transnational cooperation, solidarity actions and Emergency Assistance;
- Thematic Facility funding: Work Programme 2021-2022 in the final implementation phase, i.e. almost all funding spent;
- Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund and Internal Security Fund WPs 2023-2025 adopted, Border Management and Visa Instrument WP to be adopted in the coming days;
- We intend to publish calls for 2023 projects in the TF WP soon;
- Emergency assistance within TF 2023-2025 in total for all 3 funds almost 3 billion, providing much needed flexibility to response crisis situations;


 Negotiations with the Schengen Associated Countries (Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Switzerland) to be concluded in 2023 so as to allow them being associated to BMVI.

#### Key features of the preparatory, assessment and approval process


- Learning curve for all capacity, resources and time demanding
- Support in design to MS through networking, input with Commission 'recommendations'
- Breaking through the silos a good start
- The observations letters less prescriptive, more policy and quality driven approach
- Increased level of transparency at both EU and national levels
- Assessment and approval in the changed geopolitical context






#### CAP Strategic Plan approval – state of play

#### CAP Plan approval in terms of budget




#### Timeline of the adoption of the individual CAP Plans so far
