What is about?



- It offers the opportunity to young people to participate to decision making in EU cohesion policy
- It focuses on the regions that will be most impacted by the transition to climate neutrality, because they are heavily dependent on fossil fuels or on carbon-intensive industries.

Who can participate?

Individual or group of individuals aged 15-24

or

Non-profit organisation (private or public)

Be resident or established in one of the 27 EU Member States territories



What is for them?

Up to € 10 000 to realise a project in 12 months

Project = identify **people** that are at risk of exclusion as a result of the transition + to propose **actions** for involvement of these people in their territory in relation to **topics** close to them.

Why focus on citizens

Commissioner Ferreira «EU cohesion policy is a policy for citizens but also with citizens »

Our experience so far:

- Civic monitoring: 18 Integrity Pacts (2016-2021) enhanced transparency and accountability, stronger competition and fairness, better value for money, citizen engagement and even long-term institutional change
- Role of civil society organisations: 18 grants (2020-2021) to support them in bridging between citizens and public authorities
- Competences in public administration: technical support by OECD to 5 authorities (2020-2021) to set new process for engagement.

Objectives

- Strategic objectives:
 - Promote cooperation between public authorities and civil society organisation
 - Promote new forms of participation
- Operational objectives
 - Test innovative citizen participation approaches in cohesion policy
 - Identify conditions to build strong and long-lasting partnerships
 - Collect good practices of citizen participation in cohesion policy to be shared among and beyond project partners
 - Promote peer learning and support community of practitioners.





Implementation

- Cooperation between a public authority and civil society organization in the framework of programmes 2021-2027:
 - Joint proposal on scope for citizens engagement (e.g. design, monitoring and/or evaluation of investments, strategy or a programmes)
- Technical support by international experts from OECD:
 - Selection of the most appropriate form of citizens engagement and accompany in the implementation.
