#### **Competition categories**

- To allow every programme to participate, the competition categories will be aligned to Policy objectives (2021-2027)
- Enables authorities to better prepare and plan their applications (no more 'missing the train' for a certain, specific topic)
- Conversion table between 2021-2027 POs and 2014-2020 TOs will be provided in the guide for applicants
- No specific category for JTF, projects can apply within a suitable category

#### Focus on completed projects

- Applications of (only) completed projects will be accepted
- This is to ensure better comparability between projects, and to be better able evaluate the sustainability of the projects



#### **2** phases selection process

- In order to give applicants and jury members the possibility for exchanges 2 stage selection process will be set up.
  - First stage: an assessment of all applications on paper and a selection of 5 finalists by category by an independent jury.
  - Second stage: during the EU regions' week a 'live' presentation of the finalists in front of the jury after which the winners will be decided.



#### **National/regional competitions**

- Some Member States and regions organise their own Regiostars competitions.
- No direct link will be created between between the EU competition and the local ones, but...
- the Commission will provide visibility to these competitions and participate in the ceremony if possible.
