Methodology

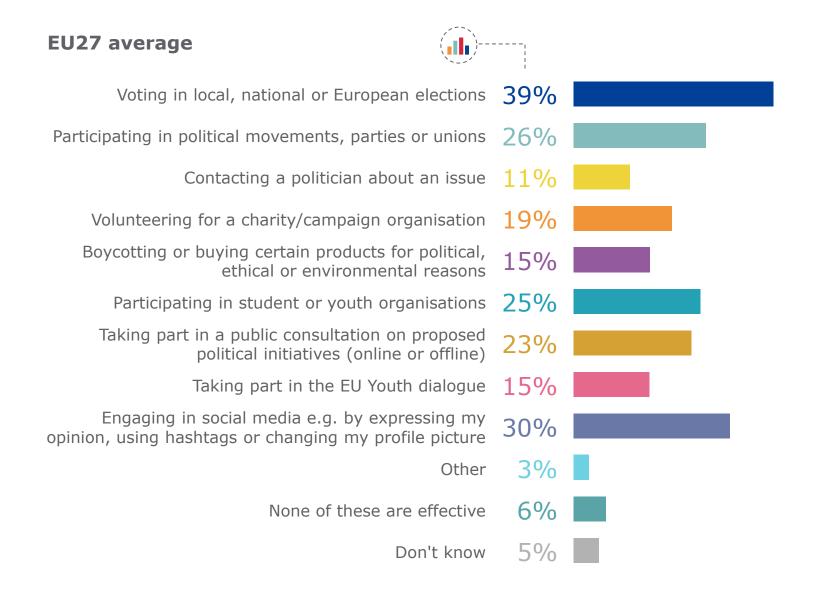
- The survey was conducted via computer-assisted web interviewing (CAWI), using Ipsos online panels and their partner network. A share of respondents in Luxembourg and Malta was recruited via social media networks.
- Fieldwork: 22 February 4 March 2022
- Target population: young EU citizens, aged 15-30
- Coverage: EU27
- Number of interviews: 26 178
- Sample size per country: 500 in LU, CY, MT, 1000 in all other countries

Presentation of survey data

• Survey data are weighted to known population proportions. The EU27 averages are weighted according to the size of the 15-30 year-old population of each EU Member State. *Note:* Percentages may not total 100 due to rounding.

Participation in one or more youth organisations over the last 12 months:

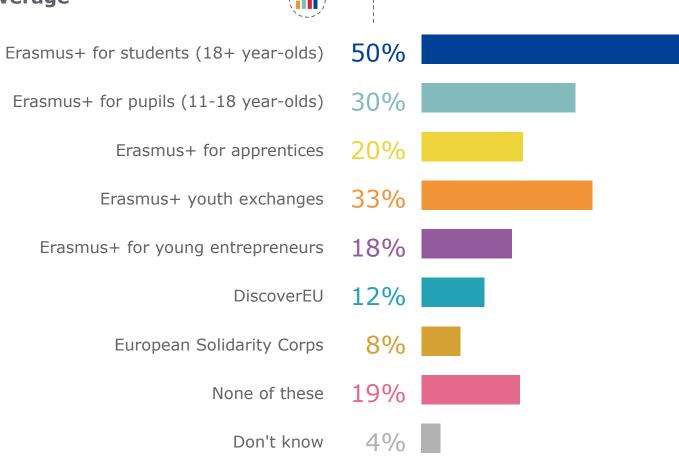

- Growing **youth engagement**: today, a majority (58%) of young people are active in the societies they live in and have participated in one or more youth organisations over the last 12 months.
- An increase of 17 % since last Eurobarometer in 2019.

Erasmus+ programme, which celebrates its 35th anniversary in 2022, is known by **more than half of young respondents**.



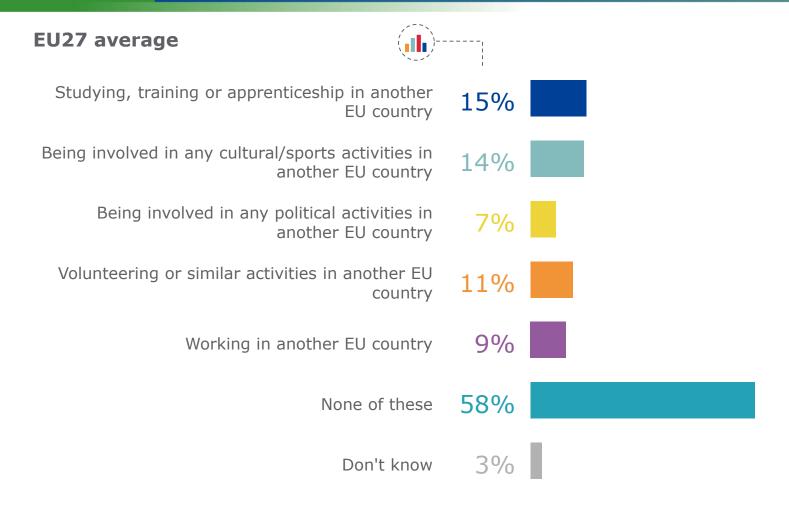

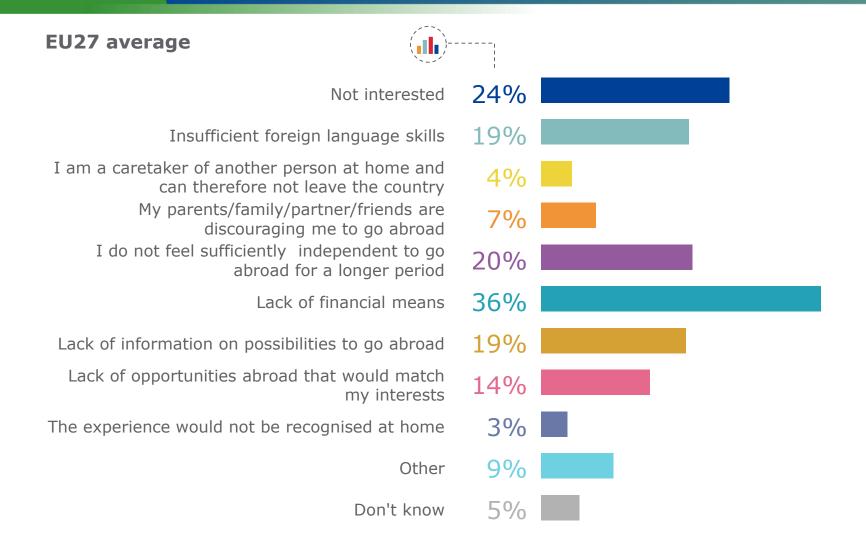
Participation in transnational activities:



This shows an increase in **transnational youth mobility** compared to 2019, reflecting the strong willingness to re-connect between young people across borders.



Reasons for stopping transnational activities:



The **lack of financial means** remains a key reason for non-participation in mobility projects, although the financial obstacle is declining (36% compared to 42% in 2019).



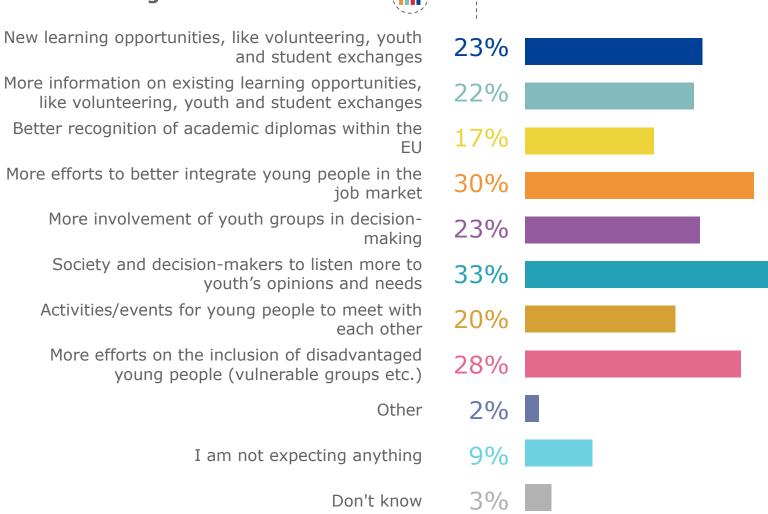
The key themes the European Year of Youth should focus on:

EU27 average

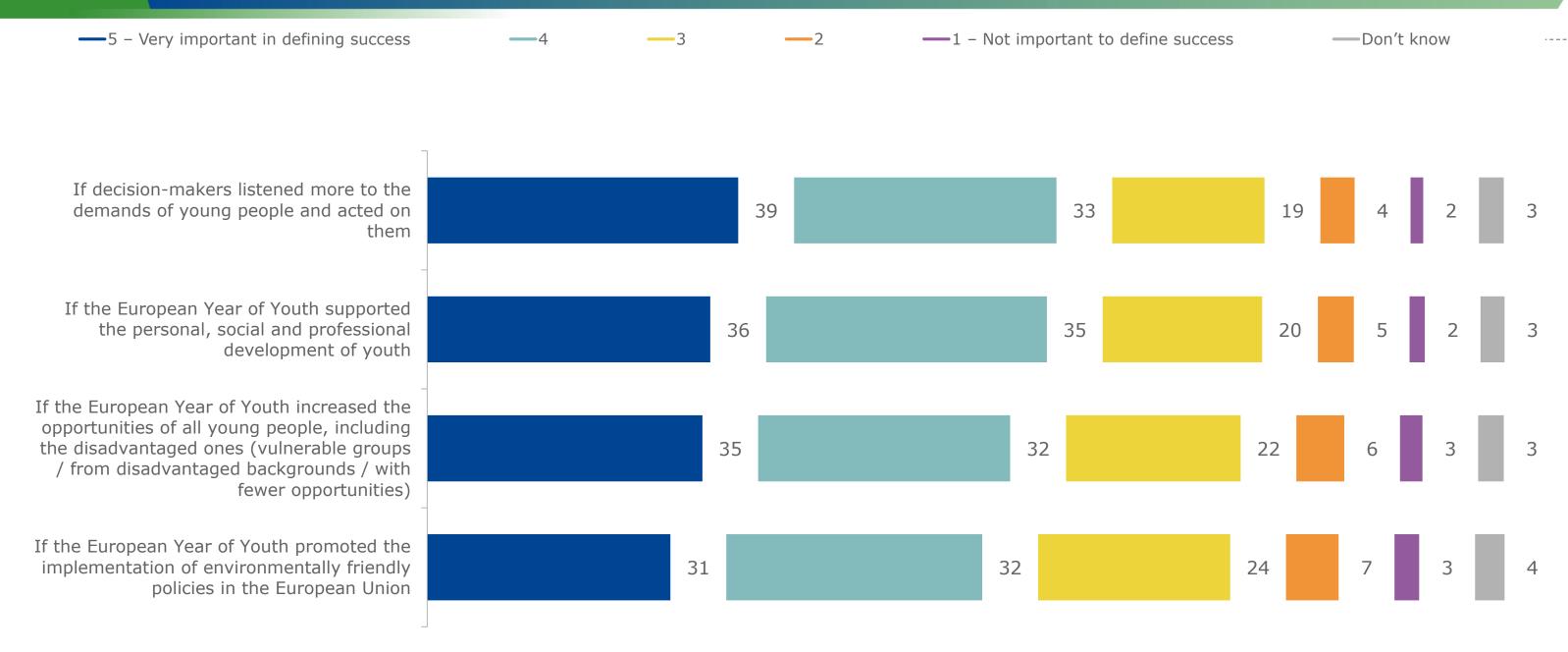


Young people's most common expectation for the 2022 European Year of Youth is for decision-makers to listen more to their demands and act on them, and to support their personal, social and professional development (72%).



What would define a 'successful' European Year of Youth?

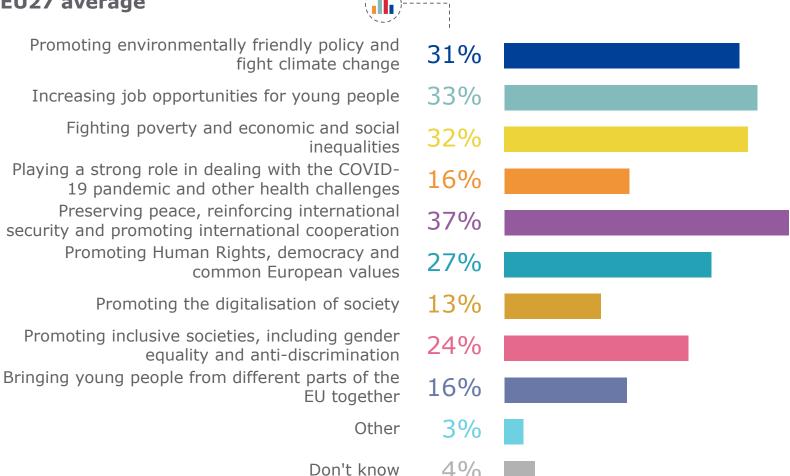






What do you expect of the European Union for your generation?

- Showing the impact of Russia's war of aggression against Ukraine, young people's first priority for the EU is to preserve peace, reinforcing international security and promoting international cooperation (37%).
- The next highest expectations are for the EU to increase job opportunities for young people (33%);
- Fight **poverty** and economic and social inequalities (32%);
- To promote environmentally friendly policies and fight climate change (31%).



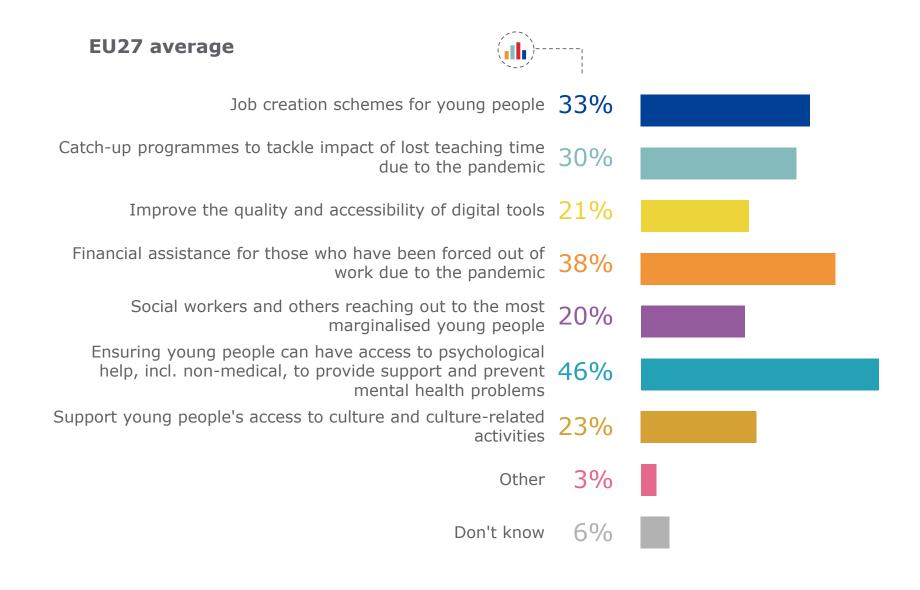
