



# Why Smart Specialization is important for regions?

 A crossing between research strengths and economic sectors with high potential for innovation and development, with the aim of transformation











# Why European regions really have to choose their areas of specialization?

- To organize the territorial strengths for driving innovation
- To unite its players around its strengths
- To target its resources
- To increase national and international visibility

funding (mechanisms) secured for corridor operations and innovation projects shared objectives, strategic alignment, and clarity on the purpose of the collaboration












