



Interregional collaboration focus in 13



- Continued thematic priorities of twin transition and smart manufacturing with additional emphasis on burning challenges and link to the New European Innovation Agenda, RIV;
- **Continued** focus on capacity building (new Call launched) underlying success factor for interregional collaboration;
- New S3 community of practice in support of partnerships, umbrella for regional innovation stakeholders, linking ideas, facilitating consortia creation;
- Strengthened cohesion policy dimension stronger integration of the less developed regions into EU value chains, more partners from the less developed regions to be included in I3 consortia;
- Same indicative project size now for both strands;
- 100% rate for cascade funding;
- Simplification S3 support letter from the coordinator only, consortia members to outline link to S3 within the application







Capacity building for interregional innovation




• Improving Capacity for Interregional Innovation Investments: Supporting public authorities and intermediaries in guiding companies towards interregional investment portfolios.

- internationalisation is a 'default' attitude
- active and strong provinces and innovation intermediaries
- TSSP, a useful permanent platform of collaboration (saving time and money)
- too much too handle?







The ideal TSSP

- Interregional cooperation projects between companies and knowledge institutes in a specific technology field or application domain
 - demonstration projects, no research (> TRL 5 post prototyping)
 - industrial commitment (to participate/lead/co-invest)
 - European dimension : added value of joint demonstration
 - expected significant impact (economic, social and environmental returns)
- European Networks of Demonstrators
- no "one off" projects / building of new industrial value chains through a pipeline of investment projects

in order to:

- accelerate market development
- global competitiveness








The 3D Printing TSSP in reality today

10 years trial-and-error



- Automatized Connections and Matchmaking
- Descriptions of relevant funding opportunities
- Matchmaking towards proposals development
- 'In-person punctual pitching'
- Promoting expertise, services, challenges, new ideas/projects
- Community building around complex and emerging topics, requiring critical mass and structural cooperation for solutions co-developments and deployment
- 'Projects meetings'







The added value of bringing TSSPs together in an umbrella structure such as Vanguard Initiative

- collectivisation of links with regional public authorities
- partial collectivisation of policy influencing activities
- partial funding of coordination tasks, allowing (more) to concentrate on core tasks
- peer learning
- stimulating cross-TSSP activities

Critical (Success) factors

- Limited resources for platform actions: e.g. for S3 management,
 communication => interregional funding helps
- (Dis)balance between frontrunners and followers
- S3 in **less developed regions** needs to overcome barriers on (political) backing. *Frontrunners to help Followers*
- Uncertainty on funding and funding instruments
- Keep Operations linked to Regional Politics and Strategy
- It takes time.....
