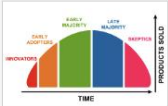
S3: An Introduction

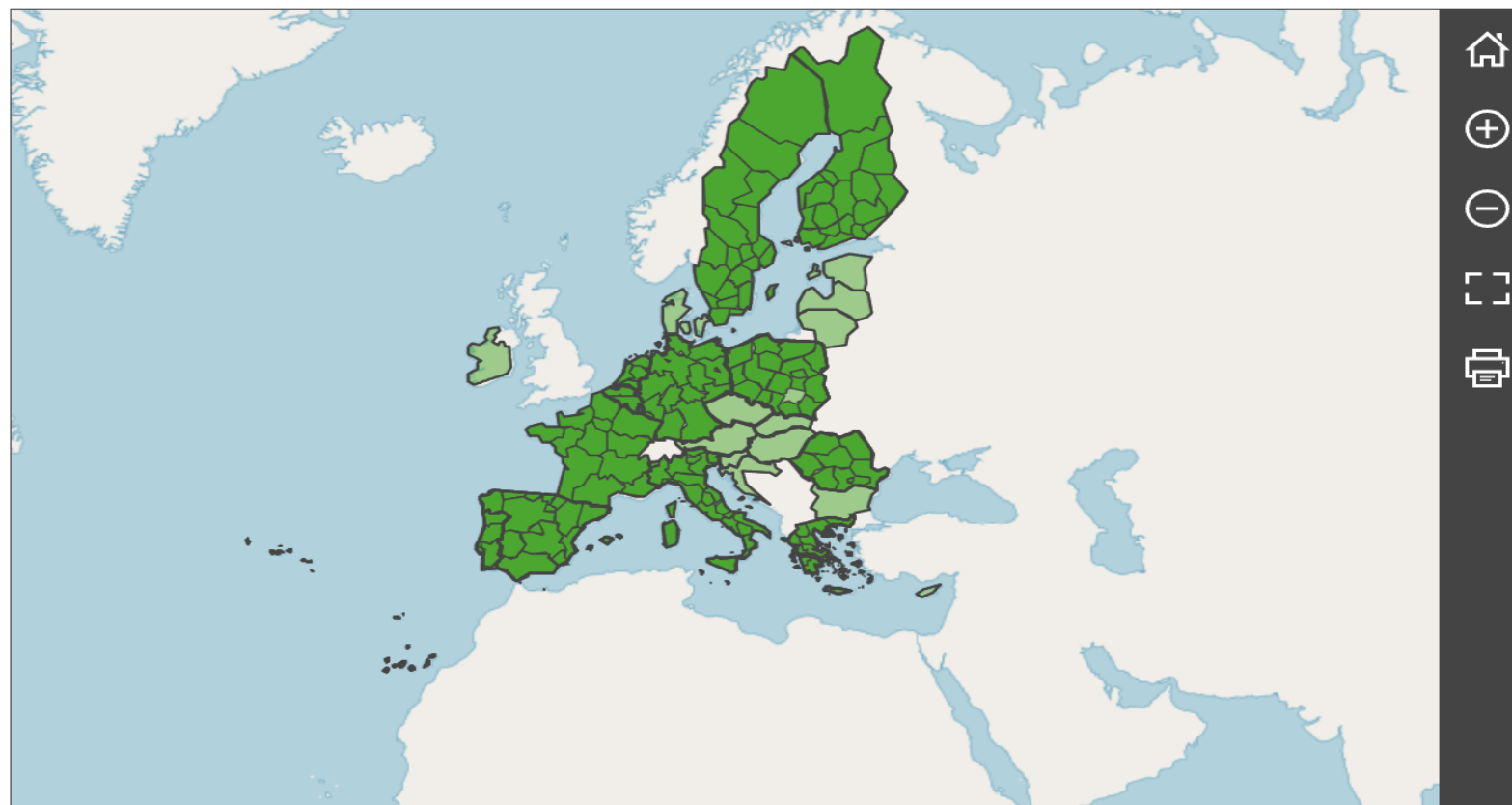

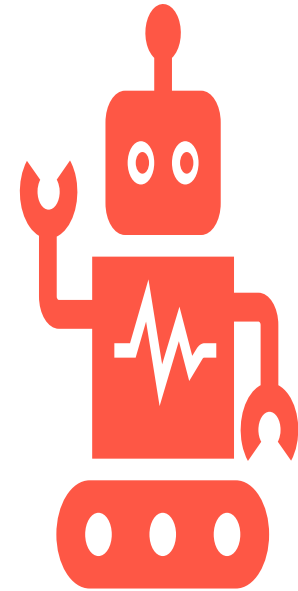
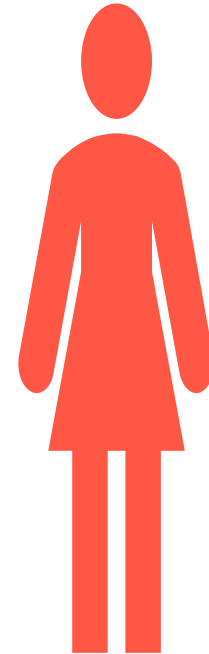

- Collaborative network of strategic Thematic Smart Specialisation Partnerships
- Promoting complementarity of regional funding for innovation in S3 areas

• 38 Thematic Smart Specialisation Partnerships (TSSPs)

- Initiate and explore new value chains in specific priority areas
- Actors: committed regions, cluster organisations, businesses and innovation actors as well as civil society (quadruple helix)

• Involving 191 unique regions

Benefits of interregional collaboration

- Participation in interregional collaboration through TSSPs requires **clear scope of activities** based on a **shared interests in their smart specialisation strategies**, as well as **strong regional commitment** together with the involvement of the **quadruple helix**.
- Benefits of participation include:
 - **Access to resources, skills, knowledge, and capabilities** that do not necessarily exist within their own regional ecosystem
 - **Support SME innovation through the ‘test before invest’ mechanism**
 - Being able to position one’s knowledge among other regions **increase the credibility and support** in one’s own region

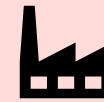

S3 Thematic Platforms are instruments to support the creation of a transnational and interregional collaborative network of strategic Thematic Smart Specialisation Partnerships (TSSPs), promoting complementarity of regional funding for innovation in specific smart specialisation areas. The S3 Thematic Platforms are created as a result of regions priorities in topical areas of their smart specialisation strategies in order to support regions to collaborate in shared smart specialisation areas.

Thematic Smart Specialisation Partnerships (TSSPs) bring together regions interested in initiating and exploring new value chains in specific priority areas based on a shared interest in their smart specialisation strategies. TSSPs target specific areas with high potential for technological, societal, and ecological return at regional and European level, underpinned by shared smart specialisation strategy priorities across committed regions, cluster organisations, businesses, and innovation actors as well as civil society. TSSPs are open to participation of regional authorities and/or quadruple helix actors with a mandate from their regional authority and have a smart specialisation strategy that has clear links to the topic.

Five main elements should be considered when aiming to set up a new partnership:

- the number of regions interested in joining the specific partnership, a partnership requires a minimum of three unique regions or organisations with a mandate from the regional authority;
- link with the underlying Smart specialisation strategy (S3) of the participating regions;
- the EU Added value of the partnership with a clear interregional scope;
- timeliness in a European policy context with links among others to the European Green Deal, Innovation Ecosystems, etc.;
- whether there is a community supporting the partnership such as cluster organisations, European-level networks, co-programmed European Partnerships, co-funded European Partnerships or Institutionalised European Partnerships (EIT KIC, Joint undertaking)

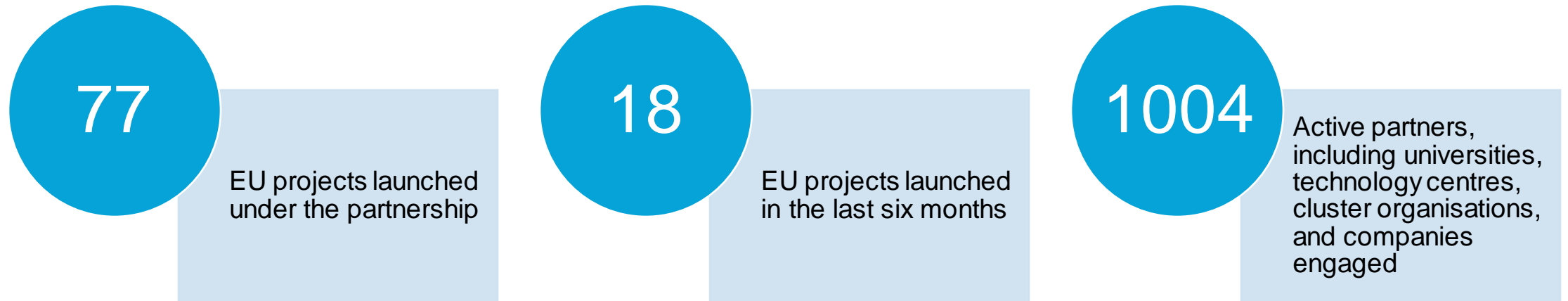
