Ex post evaluation context

- The ex post evaluations of the 2014-20 period shall be completed by the end of 2024 in line with art. 57 (2) of the Common Provisions Regulation 1303/2013 (CPR)
- BR Guidelines require us to apply broader criteria than effectiveness and efficiency. Ex-post should also cover relevance, coherence and EU added value.

Two distinct phase:

- Pre-crisis strategic aspect (should cover impact of the crisis on TOs)
- Crisis measures (incl. React EU) more qualitative analysis

This ex-post will contribute to:


evidence based decision-making and input

- transparency, accountability and communication.


Feeds into:

- impact assessment post 2027.






The ex-post cycle



2014-2020 ex-post evaluation. State of play

Art. 57 (2) CPR requires us to carry out an ex post evaluation by the end of 2024. 1st step is setting the scope.

Overall planning for next year:

- Approach confirmed by the BoD of REGIO in September
- Scoping in progress
- Scope announced mid 2021 (evaluation conference Lisbon)
- Launch of tenders end 2021



Study on monitoring data and monitoring systems



Objective and timing

- Objectives:
 - 1) to provide reliable and robust monitoring data for the thematic ex-post evaluations
 - 2) to enhance the Commission's and other stakeholders' understanding of the functioning of the programmes' monitoring systems
- Contractor will work for 14 months, starting in January 2021
- Country experts will contact Managing Authorities to collect data



Monitoring data: project database

The study will:

- collect the list of operations/projects supported under the programmes
- integrate the datasets obtained from managing authorities into a single database
- populate the database with common attributes for all projects/operations: financial information, project description and content, beneficiary, and any other common datafields (+ data cleaning and standardisation)
- typology clustering of the operations (beyond the categorization by intervention fields)
- clustering the beneficiaries by type and size



Monitoring data: indicators

Through the review of the AIRs for the years 2019 and 2020 the study will:

- provide a judgement on the plausibility/reliability and consistency of the common indicator values reported (not an audit)
- identify cases of under- and over-reported values, and the reasons for that
- assess the expenditure covered by each common indicator
- identify programme specific indictors:
 - that express deliverables (outputs) of a significant share of the programmes' financial allocation
 - that share common definitions across different programmes and potentially across different Member States

Monitoring systems

- assessment of monitoring systems' data collection and data processing arrangements: data collection and aggregation (programme/regional/national level), quality control mechanism, reporting of monitoring data to the Commission
- identifying strengths and weaknesses
- identifying good practices and making recommendations that can be considered by national authorities when designing their monitoring systems for the 2021-2027 period
