


Evaluation work in the Member States

More than 1500 MS evaluations on 2014-2020

- EC systematically reviews MS evaluations and provides tailored support to improve capacity (Evaluation Help Desk)
- Impact evaluations now 24% of 2014-20 (more than 50% in a few MS)
- Results are specific to the local contexts (by design), some common findings are starting to emerge




Thematic distribution





Impact evaluations



- 24% of 2014-2020 evaluations are impact-oriented
- 50% of them use advanced methods counterfactual, theory-based or cost-benefit analysis



Emerging common findings – Smart Europe



- Strengthened cooperation between research centres and businesses
- EU Funding crucial for the investment in R&D
- ICT infrastructure helps closing the digital divide in less developed regions (in time)
- Digitalisation of services brought positive results for businesses and public authorities
- SME support led to increased competitiveness, product diversification (new markets) and increased export



Emerging common findings – Green Europe



- Low-carbon economy investments effective, but full results in the long term
- Climate change adaptation and risk prevention measures effective beyond regional/national borders
- For water supply, wastewater treatment and waste management, it is crucial that users are connected to the infrastructure developed

ESF: lessons learned

- Support tailored to seekers and labour market improves skills and outcomes
- Traineeships more effective to increase employability
- Important to support know-how of trainers



Notable findings – cross-cutting instruments

Territorial approaches

- ITIs facilitate exchange of information, knowledge and experience
- Public participation key success factor of CLLD (e.g. PL)

Financial instruments

• Instrumental to firms growth, innovation and increased competitiveness (e.g. PL and DE)

Findings on implementation

Delayed implementation

 start-up phase, selection procedures Administrative issues may limit beneficiaries' participation

- application process
- lack of information
- size of financial incentives

Data availability

 timeliness and completeness of monitoring data

Simplification measures introduced in the new regulatory framework will contribute to improve implementation
